## 1.0 Purpose of Report

1.1 To submit for consideration by the Sub-Committee an application for a variation of a premises licence.

## 2.0 Background

- 2.1 An application has been received from the agent of the holder of the premises licence, TLTC Ltd on behalf of Eucal Shippey and Lorraine Heath in respect of The Malt Shovel, 131 Willenhall Road. Wolverhampton. WV1 2HR. A copy of the application is attached at Appendix 1.
- 2.2 It is the understanding of the licensing authority, that the application to vary this premises licence has been properly made. The statutory requirement to give notice of the application has also been complied with. The premises are located in the East Park ward and a location plan is attached at Appendix 2
- 2.3 The current application was received on 3 March 2015 and is to add hours to the licensable activities.
- 2.5 A copy of the current licence is attached at Appendix 3.
- 2.6 The following responsible authorities have been consulted on this application:

2.8 The applicant, and all of those who have made representations, has been invited to attend the hearing.

## 3.0 Legal Implications

- 3.1 Section 4(1) of the Licensing Act 2003 states that a Licensing Authority must carry out its function under the Act with a view to promoting the licensing objectives namely:
  - (a) The prevention of crime and disorder;
  - (b) Public safety;
  - (c) The prevention of public nuisance;
  - (d) The protection of children from harm.
- 3.2 The general duties imposed on Licensing Authorities means proper consideration must be given to the licensing objectives when determining a premises licence variation application.
- 3.3 In addition, regard shall be had to guidance issued by the Secretary of State under Section 182 of the Licensing Act 2003 and Wolverhampton City Council's Licensing Policy Statement. [KR/30032015/F]

## 4.0 Human Rights and Equalities Implications

- 4.1 This report has human rights implications for both the premises licence holder and the residents from the local neighbourhood. Any of the steps outlined in Section 4 of this report may have financial implications for a licensee's business and livelihood and/or may have impact upon the day to day lives of residents living in close proximity to the premises.
- 4.2 Article 8(i) of the European Convention of Human Rights provides that everyone has the right to respect for his/her private and family life and his/her home (which includes business premises). This right may be interfered with by the Council on a number of grounds including the protection of rights and freedoms of others. The First Protocol Article 1 also provides that every person is entitled to the peaceful enjoyment of his possessions and shall not be deprived of his possessions except in the public interest and conditions provided for by law. Members must accordingly make a decision which is proportionate to the hearing and endeavour to find a balance between the rights of the applicant, residents and the community as a whole.

## 5.0 Financial Implications

5.1 Councillors agreed fees and charges for this function on 26 February 2014; the fees are based on a cost recovery basis. The fee for this application is £190.00, and is non-refundable. [TK/13022014/Q]

## 6.0 **Environmental Implications**

6.1 This report has environmental implications in that there is a potential for disturbance caused by patrons using the premises and nuisance caused by litter and waste originating from the premises.



Nothing beyond existing Fire & Health and Safety Regulations, and as outlined hereafter to promote the four licensing objectives.

b) The prevention of crime and disorder

CCTV cameras are used within the premises. Recordings will be retained for 31 days, stored in accordance with the requirements of the Data Protection Act and the information commissioners. CCTV recordings will be produced to Police or authorised Responsible Authorities on demand. A staff training package will be in place for any member of staff who is not a Personal Licence holder. Records of such training or retraining will be kept and produced on demand to Police or authorised responsible authorities. Refusal books will be kept and used at the premises, and again produced to the Police or Responsible Authorities on demand. Door supervisors that are used will be registered with the SIA in accordance with current legislation.

e) Public safety

The premises have marked fire exit doors to the front and side of the premises. Fire Fighting and First aid equipment is in place at the premises. Fire exits are identified by signage and a fire evacuation policy is in place. Health & Safety laws will be fully complied with.

d) The prevention of public nuisance

Public nuisance through noise has been minimised in line with current license conditions. All efforts will be made to ensure that persons do not loiter outside the premises.

e) The protection of children from harm

A challenge 25 policy is in place. Proof of ID will be by Passport, Driving licence or pass approved card with signage to support such challenge, along with signage outlining the proxy sale offence. As previously stated refusals books will be kept and used and produced to Police or authorised Responsible Authorities on demand. Signage will be used throughout the premises outlining Challenge 25, The PASS proof of ID and PROXY sales.



Mait Shovel extension to licence objection

I write to you to put my objection to the Malt Shovel licence extension under the section of public nuisance.

For the past three or four years each summer I have had to endure on most Friday and Saturday nights loud music being played until the early hours, after 3am at times, this I feel is unacceptable given the current licensing hours of the pub.

They have constantly flouted the law by ignoring the terms of their current license. I have rung the out of hour's service on numerous times over the past few years and if these calls were logged you will be able to see for yourself.

I have also phoned the police only to be told they couldn't do anything about the noise. This problem is only a 'summer' problem as they don't go outside in the winter and therefore no music can be heard coming from the courtyard at the side of the pub.

To be able to hear such music means they must have the speakers in the courtyard (which they will deny) and I'm told they don't have a licence for this but they do it anyway. The windows being open is not a valid excuse as there are very few windows if any that open to any great extent.

They also appeared to be cooking food from the courtyard, again not sure if this is allowed. There is also the issue of the noise from the people outside the pub and also the noise when they leave the pub at all hours of the morning and also the noise of the numerous cars parked I would have thought illegally on the pavement by the pub and also the pavement across the road.
