4 Review of a Private Hire Vehicle Driver's Licence

Mr I responded to the Sub-Committee members and employees of the Council in regard to the complaint of inappropriate behaviour/conduct. He also circulated to the meeting some character references.

JL, his wife and the Section Leader (Licensing) withdrew from the meeting to enable the Sub-Committee to determine the matter. They considered all the information presented at the meeting, specifically the circumstances surrounding the complaint received by Licensing Services on 11 February 2015. They noted that a serious allegation had been made in regard to the driver's conduct on the evening of 6 February 2015. They also took into account the character references produced. The Sub-Committee believed that inappropriate conduct had taken place and: Resolved:

That, in accordance with Section 61 of the Local Government (Miscellaneous Provisions) Act 1976 and paragraph 5.1.25(a) of the Guidelines Relating to Relevance of Convictions and Breaches of Licence Conditions, the Licensing Sub-Committee have decided to suspend Mr JL's Private Hire Vehicle Driver's Licence for a period of two months.

The driver has a right of appeal against the above decision within 21 days of written receipt of this decision.
