Recommendation for action or decision:

The Licensing Sub-Committee is requested to consider this application to vary a premises licence to specify an individual as Designated Premises Supervisor.

1.0 Purpose of Report

1.1 To submit for consideration by the Sub-Committee an application to vary the designated premises supervisor on a Premises Licence.

2.0 Background

- 2.1 An application was received from Mr Phillip Adams the Premises Licence Holder. The premises licence holder is applying to vary the premises licence to specify a new individual as the designated premises supervisor.
- 2.2 The application was made on 7 December 2015 and received and accepted by Wolverhampton City Council as a properly made application. The application proposes that Mr Mohamed Amine Madani of 70 Parsons Hill Oldbury, B68 9BS, to be named as the designated premises supervisor by virtue of a request made by the applicant in accordance with Section 38 of the Licensing Act 2003. A copy of the application and consent is attached at Appendix 1.
- 2.3 The Police, have been consulted on this application as a responsible authority, and have made relevant representations and are objecting to this application. A copy of their representation is attached at Appendix 2.
- 2.5 A copy of the premises licence is attached at Appendix 3
- 2.6 The applicant, the prospective designated premises supervisor and West Midlands Police have been invited to attend the hearing.

3.0 Legal Implications

Section 37 of the Licensing Act 2003 may apply to vary the licence to specify the proposed person as the designated premises supervisor.

- 3.1 All applications shall be determined in accordance with the four licensing objectives namely:
 - The prevention of crime and disorder;
 - Public safety;
 - The prevention of public nuisance;
 - The protection of children from harm.

Section 39 of the 2003 Act provides applications to vary a person specified as a designated premises supervisor may only be rejected if it is considered necessary for the promotion of the crime and disorder objective. Regard shall be had to guidance issued by the Secretary of State under Section 182 of the Licensing Act 2003 and Wolverhampton City Council's Licensing Policy Statement. ISH/06012016/B

Mandatory Conditions

Mandatory conditions where licence authorises supply of alcohol

- (1) Where a premises licence authorises the supply of alcohol, the licence must include the following conditions:
- (2) The first condition is that no supply of alcohol may be made under the premises licence:-
 - (a) At a time when there is no designated premises supervisor in respect of the premises licence, or
 - (b) At a time when the designated premises supervisor does not hold a personal licence or his personal licence is suspended
- (3) The second condition is that every supply of alcohol under the premises licence must be made or authorised by a person who holds a personal licence.

Mandatory Conditions where the licence authorises supply of alcohol: 2010

- 1.— (1) The responsible person shall take all reasonable steps to ensure that staff on relevant premises do not carry out, arrange or participate in any irresponsible promotions in relation to the premises.
- (2) In this paragraph, an irresponsible promotion means any one or more of the following activities, or substantially similar activities, carried on for the purpose of encouraging the sale or supply of alcohol for consumption on the premises in a manner which carries a significant risk of leading or contributing to crime and disorder, prejudice to public safety, public nuisance, or harm to children—
 - (a) games or other activities which require or encourage, or are designed to require or encourage, individuals to-
 - (i) drink a quantity of alcohol within a time limit (other than to drink alcohol sold or supplied on the premises before the cessation of the period in which the responsible person is authorised to sell or supply alcohol), or
 - (ii) drink as much alcohol as possible (whether within a time limit or otherwise);
 - (b) provision of unlimited or unspecified quantities of alcohol free or for a fixed or discounted fee to the public or to a group defined by a particular characteristic (other than any promotion or discount available to an individual in respect of alcohol for consumption at a table meal, as defined in section 159 of the Act)
 - (c) provision of free or discounted alcohol or any other thing as a prize to encourage or reward the purchase and consumption of alcohol over a period of 24 hours or less;
 - (d) provision of free or discounted alcohol in relation to the viewing on the premises of a sporting event, where that provision is dependent on—
 - (i) the outcome of a race, competition or other event or process, or
 - (ii) the likelihood of anything occurring or not occurring;
 - (e) selling or supplying alcohol in association with promotional posters or flyers on, or in the vicinity of, the premises which can reasonably be considered to condone, encourage or glamorise anti-social behaviour or to refer to the effects of drunkenness in any favourable manner.
- 2. The responsible person shall ensure that no alcohol is dispensed directly by one person into the mouth of another (other than where that other person is unable to drink without assistance by reason of a disability).
- **3.** The responsible person shall ensure that free tap water is provided on request to customers where it is reasonably available.
- **4.—** (1) The premises licence holder or club premises certificate holder shall ensure that an age verification policy applies to the premises in relation to the sale or supply of alcohol.

- (2) The policy must require individuals who appear to the responsible person to be under 18 years of age (or such older age as may be specified in the policy) to produce on request, before being served alcohol, identification bearing their photograph, date of birth and a holographic mark.
- 5. The responsible person shall ensure that-
 - (a) where any of the following alcoholic drinks is sold or supplied for consumption on the premises (other than alcoholic drinks sold or supplied having been made up in advance ready for sale or supply in a securely closed container) it is available to customers in the following measures—
 - (i) beer or cider: 1/2 pint;
 - (ii) gin, rum, vodka or whisky: 25 ml or 35 ml; and
 - (iii) still wine in a glass: 125 ml; and
 - (b) customers are made aware of the availability of these measures.

Mandatory condition: exhibition of films

- (1) Where a premises licence authorises the exhibition of films, the licence must include a condition requiring the admission of children to the exhibition of any film to be restricted in accordance with this section.
- (2) Where the film classification body is specified in the licence, unless subsection (3) (b) applies, admission of children must be restricted in accordance with any recommendation made by that body.
- (3) Where:-
 - (a) The film classification body is not specified in the licence, or
 - (b) The relevant licensing authority has notified the holder of the licence that this subsection applies to the film in question; admission of children must be restricted in accordance with any recommendation made by that licensing authority.
- (4) In this section:-
 - "Children means persons aged under 18; and
 - "Film classification body" means the person or persons designated as the authority under section 4 of the Video Recordings Act 1984 (c.39) (authority to determine suitability of video works for classification).

Conditions consistent with the Operating Schedule

General

Nothing beyond existing Fire & Health &Safety regulations, and as outlined below to promote the four licensing objectives.

The prevention of crime and disorder

CCTV will be used within the premises, retained for 31 days, stored in accordance with the requirements of the Information Commisioners, and produced to Police or responsible authorities on demand.

In the event of door staff being used they will be SIA registered, It is our intention to join the Bilston pubwatch and work closeley with the Police and other businesses to ban persons involved in unruly or criminal behaviour.

A staff training package will be put into place to cover incidents arising at the premises. Records of training and re-training will be kept and produced on demand to Police or responsible authorities. It is our intention to work closely with the Police and Licensing Officer.

Public safety

The premises have large fire exit doors at the rear leading to an unobstructed rear car park which leads into Bow Street. The premises will have up to date fire sensor devices and fire panel fire fighting and first aid equipment is within the premises in the event of injury or incident. Fire exits will be identified by signage and a staff fire evacuation policy will be in place. Health and Safety laws will be fully complied with and operated.

A staff training policy will be put into place.

- 1. The occupancy of the premises will not exceed 120 persons and suitable management procedures will be adopted to ensure that this occupancy is not exceeded.
- 2. The fire alarm system is to comply with BS5839, Part 1 2002.
- 3. The fire alarms system will be fitted with a suitable cut out device which silences any amplified music upon actuation of the fire alarm system.
- 4.1 The emergency lighting system will comply with the relevant British standard 5266 part 1.
- 4.2 (Maintained type) Illuminated 'FIRE EXIT' signs will be provided over all Fire Exits and room exits leading to fire exits.
- 5. Upholstered seating furniture will satisfy, as a minimum standard, Ignition Source O (cigratte test) and Crib Ignition Source 5 as specified in BS5852, 1990, 'Methods of Test for Assessment of the Ignitibility of Upholstered Seating by Smouldering and Flaming Ignition Sources'.
- 6. The building will be separated from any adjacent buildings by infilling the interconnected door to achieve a minimum separation of 1 hours fire resistance.
- 7. Wall and ceiling linings are to be Class 1, surface spread of flame (as described in BS476, Part 7) in the public areas. Class 0, in escape routes (as defined in the Building Regulations).
- 8. Artificial foliage and other decorative effects will be fire retardant to the satisfaction of the Fire Authority.
- 9. Prior to the premises opening certificates of conformity will be provided to the Fire Authority in respect of items 2, 4 an 5.

The prevention of public nuisance

Levels can be greed if required with the responsible authority. The rear fire escape doors will be closed during entertainments, there are no windows in the premises. Signage will be used requesting customers to respect our neighbours privacy on leaving the premises. Rubbish will be collected by a contractor on a regular basis. The front of the premises will be used to enter and leave the premises other than in the need of public safety, fire tests and similar occurences.

Noise or vibration should not be allowed to emanate from the premises so as to cause a nuisance to nearby properties or residents.

The rear fire doors at the premises must remain closed at all times during regulated entertainment, unless required in the event of a fire.

Access and egress to the premises will be via the front doors only.

Persons will only be permitted to smoke at the outside the front of the premises.

Music will be provided via a juke box or the use of other amplified equipment. Music will be of a background nature only. Should the premises be booked for specific events written notification will be given for Temporary Event Notices as required and in accordance with the Licensing Act 2003.

The Premises Licence Holder, Designated Premises Supervisor, or other suitably trained and responsible person at the premises must undertake noise monitoring patrols at the boundary of the premises to ensure that music/noise is not allowed to emanate from the premises at an unacceptable level when regulated entertainment takes place.

Notices should be displayed inside the premises close to the exits advising patrons to leave the premises quietly and to respect residents living in the vicinity.

The protection of children from harm

No person under 18 shall be allowed onto the premises. The premises will still use a challenge 21 policy regardless, and prove of age by passport, photo driving licence or approved identification card will be required.

Recommendation for action or decision:

The Licensing Sub-Committee is required to consider the application by West Midlands Police for a review of the above Premises Licence, following an expedited review.

Purpose of Report

1.1 The Licensing Sub-Committee is required to consider the application by West Midlands Police for a Review of the above Premises Licence, following an Expedited Review.

2.0 **Background**

2.1 The current premises licence is attached at Appendix 1.

An application was received from the Chief Officer of Police for West Midlands on 16 December 2015 for a review of the Premises Licence in respect of this premises. The premises are situated in the Bilston East ward and a location plan is attached at Appendix 2.

- 2.2 A Licensing Sub-Committee hearing was held on 17 December 2015 to determine the interim steps to be applied to the Premises Licence pending the full review hearing. The Licensing Sub-Committee resolved to suspend the Premises Licence as the interim step.
- 2.3 The notice of review has been properly served on all the Responsible Authorities. The Council has complied with the legislative process and displayed the appropriate notice at the premises and on its website as required, when the application for review was made.
- 2.4 A copy of the expedited review application can be found at Appendix 3 of this report.
- 2.5 Representations have been received from the Licensing Authority as a Responsible Authority and these can be found at Appendix 4 of this report.
- 2.5 The applicant for review, the Premises Licence Holder, and those who have made representations have been invited to attend the review hearing.

3.0 Legal Implications

- 3.1 The Licensing Authority must consider the application for the review under Section 53A of the licensing act.
- 3.2 The Licensing Sub-Committee is asked to determine the review under Section 53A (2) (b) in accordance with Section 53C of the Act. The licensing authority must hold a hearing and consider the application for review and any relevant representations.
- 3.3 The Sub-Committee must consider what steps (if any) should be taken to secure the promotion of the licensing objectives. The four licensing objectives are:
- 3.4 The four licensing objectives are:
 - The prevention of crime and disorder;

- Public safety;
- The prevention of public nuisance;
- The protection of children from harm.
- 3.5 The steps that may be taken by the Sub-Committee on a full review are:
 - (a) Modify the conditions of the licence;
 - (b) Exclude a licensable activity from the scope of the licence;
 - (c) Remove the designated premises supervisor;
 - (d) Suspend the licence for a period not exceeding 3 months;
 - (e) The revocation of the Licence.
- 3.6 In addition, regard shall be had to guidance issued by the Secretary of State under Section 182 of the Licensing Act 2003 and Wolverhampton City Council's Licensing Policy Statement. [SH/06012016/P]

4.0 Human Rights and Equalities Implications

- 4.1 This report has human rights implications for both the premises licence holder and the residents from the local neighbourhood. Any of the steps outlined in Section 4 of this report may have financial implications for a licensee's business and livelihood and/or may have impact upon the day to day lives of residents living in close proximity to the premises.
- 4.2 Article 8(i) of the European Convention of Human Rights provides that everyone has the right to respect for his/her private and family life and his/her home (which includes business premises). This right may be interfered with by the Council on a number of grounds including the protection of rights and freedoms of others. The First Protocol Article 1 also provides that every person is entitled to the peaceful enjoyment of his possessions and shall not be deprived of his possessions except in the public interest and conditions provided for by law. Members must accordingly make a decision which is proportionate to the hearing and endeavour to find a balance between the rights of the applicant, residents and the community as a whole.

5.0 Financial Implications

5.1 Councillors agreed fees and charges for this function on 21 January 2015; the fees are based on a cost recovery basis. There is no fee for the application of a Review, and there are no financial implications arising from this report.

6.0 **Environmental Implications**

6.1 This report has environmental implications in that there is a potential for disturbance caused by patrons using the premises and nuisance caused by litter and waste originating from the premises

 - (c) provision of free or discounted alcohol or any other thing as a prize to encourage or reward the purchase and consumption of alcohol over a period of 24 hours or less;
 - (d) provision of free or discounted alcohol in relation to the viewing on the premises of a sporting event, where that provision is dependent on—
 - (i) the outcome of a race, competition or other event or process, or
 - (ii) the likelihood of anything occurring or not occurring;
 - (e) selling or supplying alcohol in association with promotional posters or flyers on, or in the vicinity of, the premises which can reasonably be considered to condone, encourage or glamorise anti-social behaviour or to refer to the effects of drunkenness in any favourable manner.
- **2.** The responsible person shall ensure that no alcohol is dispensed directly by one person into the mouth of another (other than where that other person is unable to drink without assistance by reason of a disability).
- **3.** The responsible person shall ensure that free tap water is provided on request to customers where it is reasonably available.
- **4.** (1) The premises licence holder or club premises certificate holder shall ensure that an age verification policy applies to the premises in relation to the sale or supply of alcohol.

- (2) The policy must require individuals who appear to the responsible person to be under 18 years of age (or such older age as may be specified in the policy) to produce on request, before being served alcohol, identification bearing their photograph, date of birth and a holographic mark.
- 5. The responsible person shall ensure that-
 - (a) where any of the following alcoholic drinks is sold or supplied for consumption on the premises (other than alcoholic drinks sold or supplied having been made up in advance ready for sale or supply in a securely closed container) it is available to customers in the following measures—
 - (i) beer or cider: ½ pint;
 - (ii) gin, rum, vodka or whisky: 25 ml or 35 ml; and
 - (iii) still wine in a glass: 125 ml; and
 - (b) customers are made aware of the availability of these measures.

Conditions consistent with the Operating Schedule

General

Nothing beyond existing Fire & Health &Safety regulations, and as outlined below to promote the four licensing objectives.

The prevention of crime and disorder

CCTV will be used within the premises, retained for 31 days, stored in accordance with the requirements of the Information Commisioners, and produced to Police or responsible authorities on demand.

In the event of door staff being used they will be SIA registered, It is our intention to join the Bilston pubwatch and work closeley with the Police and other businesses to ban persons involved in unruly or criminal behaviour.

A staff training package will be put into place to cover incidents arising at the premises. Records of training and re-training will be kept and produced on demand to Police or responsible authorities. It is our intention to work closely with the Police and Licensing Officer.

Public safety

The premises have large fire exit doors at the rear leading to an unobstructed rear car park which leads into Bow Street. The premises will have up to date fire sensor devices and fire panel fire fighting and first aid equipment is within the premises in the event of injury or incident. Fire exits will be identified by signage and a staff fire evacuation policy will be in place. Health and Safety laws will be fully complied with and operated. A staff training policy will be put into place.

- 1. The occupancy of the premises will not exceed 120 persons and suitable management procedures will be adopted to ensure that this occupancy is not exceeded.
- 2. The fire alarm system is to comply with BS5839, Part 1 2002.
- 3. The fire alarms system will be fitted with a suitable cut out device which silences any amplified music upon actuation of the fire alarm system.
- 4.1 The emergency lighting system will comply with the relevant British standard 5266 part 1.
- 4.2 (Maintained type) Illuminated 'FIRE EXIT' signs will be provided over all Fire Exits and room exits leading to fire exits.
- 5. Upholstered seating furniture will satisfy, as a minimum standard, Ignition Source O (cigratte test) and Crib Ignition Source 5 as specified in BS5852, 1990, 'Methods of Test for Assessment of the Ignitibility of Upholstered Seating by Smouldering and Flaming Ignition Sources'.
- 6. The building will be separated from any adjacent buildings by infilling the interconnected door to achieve a minimum separation of 1 hours fire resistance.
- 7. Wall and ceiling linings are to be Class 1, surface spread of flame (as described in BS476, Part 7) in the public areas. Class 0, in escape routes (as defined in the Building Regulations).
- 8. Artificial foliage and other decorative effects will be fire retardant to the satisfaction of the Fire Authority.
- 9. Prior to the premises opening certificates of conformity will be provided to the Fire Authority in respect of items 2, 4 an 5.

The prevention of public nuisance

Levels can be greed if required with the responsible authority. The rear fire escape doors will be closed during entertainments, there are no windows in the premises. Signage will be used requesting customers to respect our neighbours privacy on leaving the premises. Rubbish will be collected by a contractor on a regular basis. The front of the premises will be used to enter and leave the premises other than in the need of public safety, fire tests and similar occurences.

Noise or vibration should not be allowed to emanate from the premises so as to cause a nuisance to nearby properties or residents.

The rear fire doors at the premises must remain closed at all times during regulated entertainment, unless required in the event of a fire.

Access and egress to the premises will be via the front doors only.

Persons will only be permitted to smoke at the outside the front of the premises.

Music will be provided via a juke box or the use of other amplified equipment. Music will be of a background nature only. Should the premises be booked for specific events written notification will be given for Temporary Event Notices as required and in accordance with the Licensing Act 2003.

The Premises Licence Holder, Designated Premises Supervisor, or other suitably trained and responsible person at the premises must undertake noise monitoring patrols at the boundary of the premises to ensure that music/noise is not allowed to emanate from the premises at an unacceptable level when regulated entertainment takes place.

Notices should be displayed inside the premises close to the exits advising patrons to leave the premises quietly and to respect residents living in the vicinity.



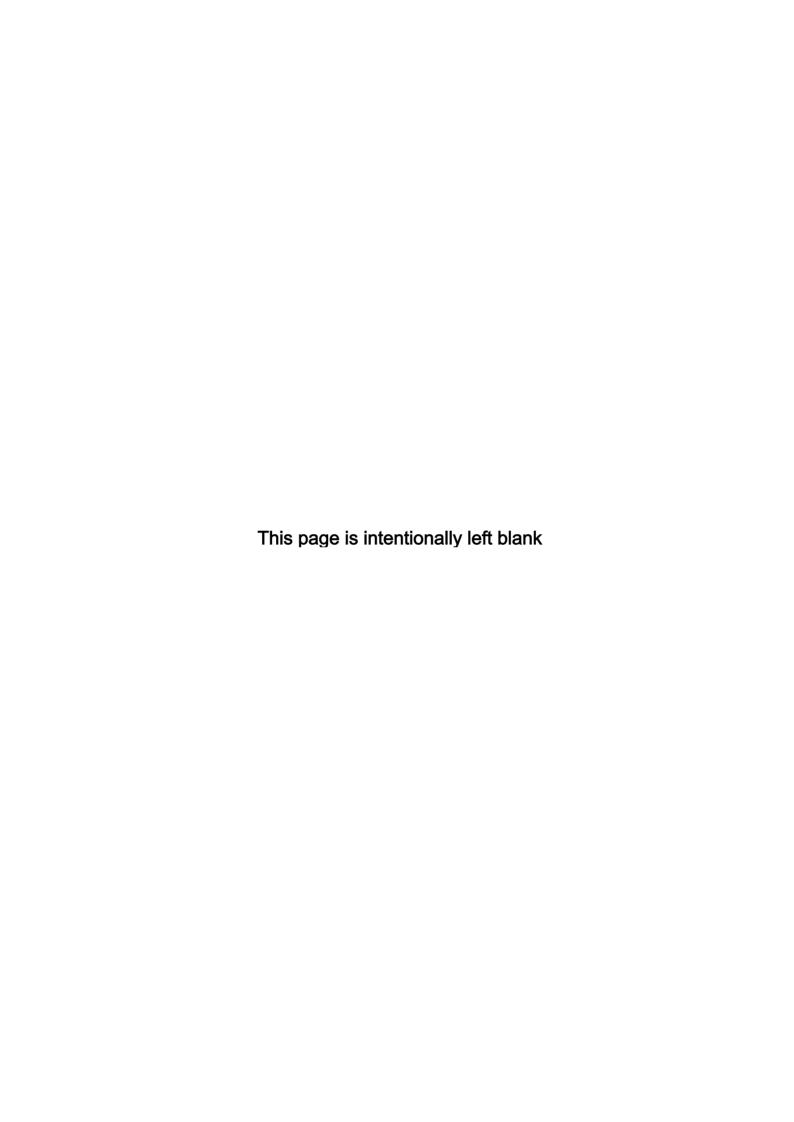

Police are defined as a 'Responsible Authority' under the Licensing Act 2003 and as such have statutory obligation to ensure that licensed premises comply with the requirements of the Act and the operating schedule relating to that premises.

This review is bought under 'The Prevention of Crime and Disorder' and 'Public Safety' licensing objectives.

Serious crime has occurred at the premises and several licence breaches have subsequently been identified that undermine the licensing objectives.

This review application outlines a recent incident of serious crime and disorder that took place at the premises. During the course of the investigation into the matter, several concerning licence breaches have been identified.

Malones Bar public house is situated at 35a Lichfield Street, Bilston, Wolverhampton. It is an outer city property that is situated on the main thoroughfare between Wolverhampton and Bilston. It is surrounded by mainly commercial premises and is a short distance from Bilston High Street.

The hours of trading are Monday to Sunday; 10:00hrs to 00:30hrs with alcohol sales between 10:00hrs to 00:00hrs.

The premises licence holder is Mr Phillip ADAMS of 7 Linton Croft, Bilston, Wolverhampton, WV14 0QE.

Mr Garfield McDONALD is the DPS; he has been in post since December 2013. Mr McDONALD holds a current valid personal licence; reference number WS/PEL/1674 issued by Walsali Council.

On Saturday the 7th of November 2015 at 02:48 hours, a 999 call was made from the callers' home address, stating that her son has been beaten up outside the Spread Eagle and the offender is known to them. The offender is then named by the caller. The caller then requests an ambulance and claims her son has had his face smashed in and knuckles injured.

Officers were despatched to the address and have spoken with the victim of the assault and obtained clarity on the details however, due to the victim being intoxicated and having injuries he was taken by ambulance to hospital for treatment. During his initial explanation of the incident, the victim stated he had been at Maiones, 35a Lichfield Street and had been set upon by a group of males. He then names the main offender and describes being attacked and having his mobile phone and house keys stolen.

The victim attended Wolverhampton Police station at around 16:30 hours on the 7th of November 2015 and provided a full witness statement, a redacted copy of which is attached.

A crime number for Robbery was issued under reference number 20WV/205140F(15 with a copy attached (redacted accordingly).

Log number 315 - 07/11/2015 refers and is attached (redacted accordingly).

Summary of male victim witness statement: (From now on referred to as MV) MV reports that he had been out drinking in Wolverhampton with his father and had been out since 21:30 hours on Friday the 6th of November 2015. When the pub they were in closed at around 02:00 hours, they got into a taxi and went to a venue later identified as being Malones Bar. MV states that when they arrived, he went to the cashpoint and withdrew some money. The MV's father waited outside Malones for him. When MV joined his father, he knocked the door to the pub and they were let

inside. He describes there being heavy smoke inside the pub due to the people smoking in there. He states there were around ten people at the bar area, 10 people at the rear of the pub and two Asian men working behind the bar. MV describes how he ordered a Southern Comfort and lemonade and a pint of lager for his father and paid the barman with a ten pound note.

He then states that he saw a male who he recognised from school days and named him, giving a description. MV approached this male, who he later identifies as his assallant, and strikes up a conversation. Very soon after, the assailant punches him to the left side of his face with such force, it knocked him backwards causing his hat to fail off. MV picked himself up and went to leave the premises but the door was locked from inside. He was eventually allowed out after asking someone and began running fowards Bilston police station. MV realises at this point he is being chased by the male who punched him. The male tripped him up, causing him to fall down and injuring his knees and elbows. He then describes being punched numerous times to the head and face and the main assallant being joined by other males who began kicking him to the head and face. It is at this stage MV describes the main assailant going through his pockets and removing his mobile telephone. MV remembers being searched and also having his cash taken from his pockets. After his father intervened, the assailants ran back to Malones Bar. MV and his father left the location and went to McDonalds nearby where his father called for a taxi to take them home. It is at this point that MV describes the injuries he sustained and treatment he

There is a further statement obtained from MV that clarifies the address of the incident being at Malones Bar and some further details regarding his mobile phone.

This investigation is live and on-going at the time of writing and the identified offender is actively being sought by police.

It is noteworthy to raise at this stage that no call to the police was made by Mr McDONALD or indeed anyone else at the location at the time the incident was taking place or anytime afterwards.

As part of the criminal investigation into this offence of robbery, CCTV footage has been provided by Mr McDONALD from the venue which clearly shows the incident inside Malones Bar in its entirety.

CCTV Summary:

The CCTV footage is very clear although there are some of the cameras on the system that do not work. The main areas are covered and do capture the initial assault and some other blatant disregards not only of the license conditions of the premises, but the law.

It has been established that the timestamp on the system has not been adjusted since the clocks went back in October therefore, the time display is an hour fast. The footage is from internal and external cameras and begins at 03:00hours And runs until 03:30hours (02:00hours and 02:30hours real time).

Only the relevant footage has been cut together from the working cameras to show the incident and begins with an external view at 03:05hrs with the MV and his father and a further unidentified female arriving outside Malones in a taxi. There is a short

delay as MV moves off screen but when he returns, both he and his father knock on the front door of the venue and are allowed access. The internal footage the shows MV and his father move inside and approach the bar. A transaction is made and MV then approaches his assailant. A short conversation takes place resulting in the assailant punching MV in the face. MV falls backwards, striking his head on the bar and falls to the floor. The assailant then pours a drink over MV and swings another punch but misses. MV walks towards the door he came in and leaves the venue. The camera then switches to an alternate view of the above described assault and shows the same but from a different angle.

MV leaves the location and runs out into the street. After a few moments, the assailant runs after MV and also out of the venue. The rest of the attack is not caught on Majones Bar footage.

At 03:10hrs the offender returns to Maiones and is allowed access back into the venue by one of the bar staff who appears to have been stood in the doorway outside, watching the robbery take place.

The footage that follows is a snapshot of the 30 minutes of video provided. It shows patrons coming and going, smoking inside the venue not only by customers but by bar staff and more worryingly, drug dealing and drug taking openly taking place.

On Monday the 30th of November 2015, Mr Garfield McDONALD attended a meeting with police licensing officers at Wolverhampton Police station. He was cautioned, shown the CCTV footage and asked a number of questions. His answers were recorded and everyone present was invited to sign the Interview transcript. A full copy of the contemporaneous interview is attached labelled; MG15 - record of interview.

On Tuesday the 1st of December 2015, the police licensing department received a written police statement from PC 8391 SHERAR. The statement relates to the officer stopping a vehicle at around 01:20 hours on Saturday the 28th November 2015 on Bow Street car park, Bilston, which is the car park at the rear of Malones. The officer describes an interaction with the vehicle occupants who stated to him they were going to Malones Bar. The officer also describes seeing a number of cars pulling up and people walking into Malones Bar from the rear. Once the vehicle occupants had finished with PC SHERAR, they also went into Malones Bar. The officer describes driving past the premises from the front and stated that it appeared locked up.

West Midlands Police are gravely concerned regarding the running and operation of these premises and the nature of incidents that go on there. The identified breaches of the premises licence are clearly a regular occurrence.

Police cannot support this venue when there is a blatant disregard and deliberate non-compliance towards the licensing objectives and seek revocation of the premises licence accordingly, to ensure the promotion of the licensing objectives.



Malones Bar public house is situated at 35a Lichfield Street, Bilston, Wolverhampton. It is an outer city property that is situated on the main thoroughfare between Wolverhampton and Bilston. It is surrounded by mainly commercial premises and is a short distance from Bilston High Street.

The hours of trading are Monday to Sunday; 10:00hrs to 00:30hrs with alcohol sales between 10:00hrs to 00:00hrs.

This application outlines a recent incident of serious crime and disorder that took place at the premises. During the course of the investigation into the matter, several further concerning licence breaches have been identified.

The brief circumstances of the incident are as follows:

On Saturday the 7th of November 2015 at 02:48 hours, a 999 call was made stating a male had been beaten up outside the premises and the offender was known to the victim. The caller then requests an ambulance and claims the male had his face smashed in and knuckles injured.

At this point, a criminal investigation was launched by police.

During the initial explanation of the incident, the victim stated he had been at Malones, 35a Lichfield Street and had been set upon by a group of males. He then names the main offender and describes being attacked and having his mobile phone and house keys stolen.

Witness statements have been provided by those involved in the incident and CCTV evidence has been obtained from the venue in question.

This investigation is live and on-going at the time of writing and the offender is actively being sought by police.

A licensing investigation commenced by police into the identified breaches of the premises licence and subsequently, a review application was submitted by West Midlands police on the 7th of December 2015.

During this process a transfer Designated Premises Supervisor application was received from the Premises Licence Holder, nominating a new person for the post.

Police have made extensive enquiries into the proposed DPS and it is the result of these enquiries that give rise to this expedited review application.

To allow the operation of this venue under the current structure with the proposed applicant in place, would allow serious criminal activity to continue at the premises.

The initial review application was bought due to an incident of serious crime that occurred in the venue, outside of its' operating hours.

West Midlands Police fear for the safety of both the public and customers of the venue, should it remain open and continue operating. On this basis police will be seeking interim steps of an immediate suspension of the premises licence pending the full review.

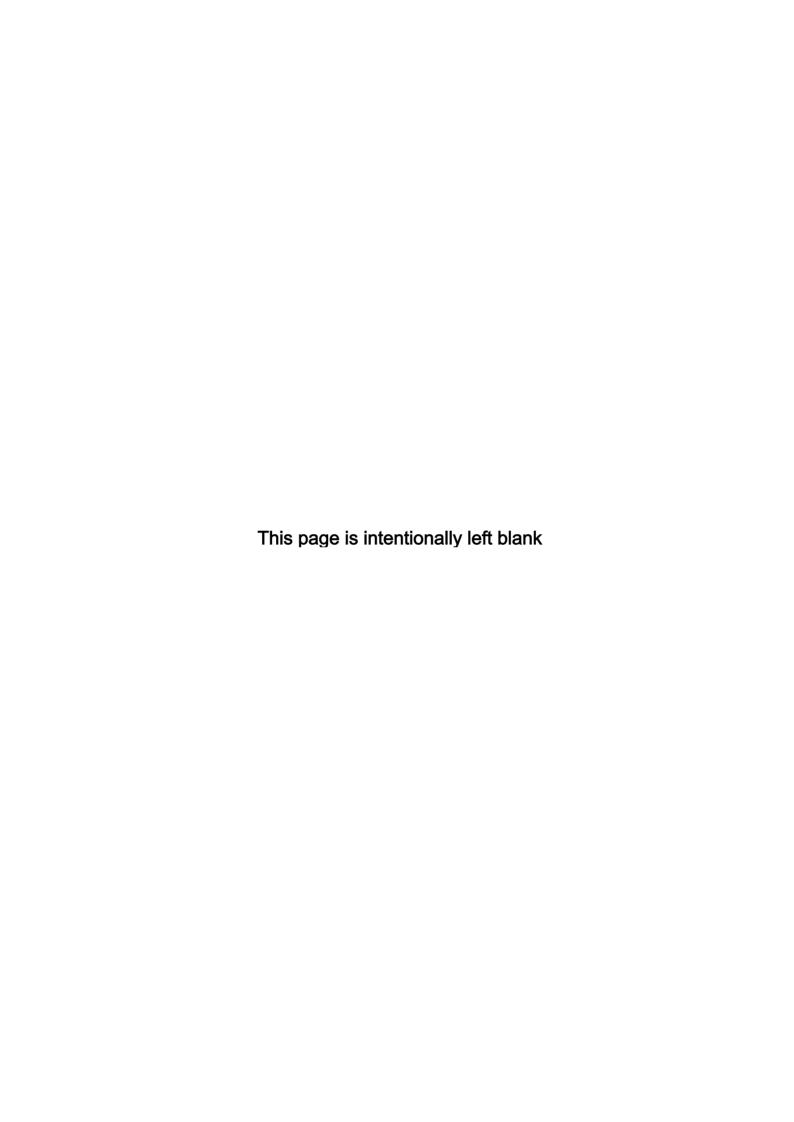

I write on behalf of the Licensing Authority as a responsible authority. I write in support of the above review application made by Chief Constable of West Midlands Police. Representations are made against the prevention of crime and disorder licensing objective and the failure of the current management of the premises to promote this licensing objective.

The premises licence holder, Phillip Adams and the management of the premises have not demonstrated they are operating in accordance with their premises licence and therefore are not promoting the licensing objective of the prevention of crime and disorder.

The issues raised by the Police relate to offences of robbery, wounding and the supply of drugs at the premises. This shows a blatant disregard to the licensing objective of the prevention of crime and disorder by the premises licence holder and the management of the premises.

If Councillors are satisfied that illegal activities have taken place at the premises and are in breach of promoting the licensing objectives, the Licensing Authority would request the Licensing Sub-Committee ensure these issues are addressed by considering modification of the current premises licence in accordance with Section 52 of The Licensing Act 2003 and guidance issued by the Secretary of State under 182 of the Act together with Wolverhampton City Council's Statement of Licensing Policy.

Councillors may conclude from the evidence given within the review application and at the hearing in order to promote the prevention of crime and disorder licensing objective it is necessary to suspend or revoke the licence due to the serious nature of the incidents/criminal activity at the premises.

The Licensing Authority fully supports the review application brought by the West Midlands Police and concludes the above issues should be resolved in order to promote the licensing objective of crime and disorder.
