The Licensing Sub-Committee is requested to consider an application for a new premises licence.

1.0 Purpose of Report

1.1 To submit for consideration by the Sub-Committee an application for a new premises licence.

2.0 Background

- 2.1 The application was received on 2 August 2017 from Lockett & Co on behalf of Shell UK Oil Products Limited for a premises licence in respect of Shell Wolverhampton, Birmingham Road, Wolverhampton, WV2 3LH. A copy of the application can be found at Appendix 1.
- 2.2 The premises are in the Blakenhall ward and a location plan can be found at Appendix 2.
- 2.3 The application is in respect of sale and supply of alcohol off the premises and the provision of Late Night Refreshment.
- 2.4 It is the understanding of the Licensing Authority that the application for this premises licence has been properly made. The statutory requirement to give notice of the application has also been complied with.
- 2.5 The following responsible authorities have been consulted on this application:
 - Licensing Authority
 - Environmental Health
 - Planning
 - Trading Standards
 - Social Services
 - Director of Public Health
 - West Midlands Police
 - West Midlands Fire Service
- 2.6 Relevant representations have been received from:
 - Licensing Authority
 - West Midlands Police

Copies of the representations can be found at Appendices 3 and 4.

2.7 The applicant and all those who have submitted representations have been invited to attend the hearing.

3.0 Legal implications

- 3.1 Part 4(1) of the Licensing Act 2003 states that a Licensing Authority must carry out its function under the Act with a view to promoting the Licensing Objectives, namely:
 - a. The prevention of crime and disorder:

- b. Public safety;
- c. The prevention of public nuisance;
- d. The protection of children from harm.

Section 18 of the Licensing Act 2003 provides that where a relevant licensing authority receives an application for a premises licence properly made in accordance with Section 17 of the Act it must grant the licence, subject to any relevant conditions.

However, where relevant representations are made the authority must hold a hearing (unless all parties agree this is unnecessary) and having regard to the representations, take such of the following steps as it considers appropriate for the promotion of the licensing objectives.

The steps are:

- 1. To grant the licence subject to conditions
- 2. To exclude from the scope of the licence any of the licensable activities to which the application relates
- 3. To refuse to specify a person as a premises supervisor
- 4. To reject the application
- 3.2 The general duties imposed on Licensing Authorities means proper consideration must be given to the Licensing Objectives when determining a premises licence application.
- 3.3 Regard shall be had to guidance issued by the Secretary of State under Section 182 and Wolverhampton City Council's Licensing Policy statement. [RB/08092017/Q]
- 4.0 Human Rights and Equalities Implications
- 4.1 This report has human rights implications for both the premises licence holder and the residents from the local neighbourhood. Any of the steps outlined in Section 4 of this report may have financial implications for a licensee's business and livelihood and/or may have impact upon the day to day lives of residents living in close proximity to the premises.
- 4.2 Article 8(i) of the European Convention of Human Rights provides that everyone has the right to respect for his/her private and family life and his/her home (which includes business premises). This right may be interfered with by the Council on a number of grounds including the protection of rights and freedoms of others. The First Protocol Article 1 also provides that every person is entitled to the peaceful enjoyment of his possessions and shall not be deprived of his possessions except in the public interest and conditions provided for by law. Members must accordingly make a decision which is proportionate to the hearing and endeavour to find a balance between the rights of the applicant, residents and the community as a whole.

5.0 Financial Implications

NOTES ON DEMONSTRATING ENTITLEMENT TO WORK IN THE UK

Entitlement to work/immigration status for individual applicants and applications from partnerships which are not limited liability partnerships:

A licence may not be held by an individual or an individual in a partnership who is resident in the UK who:

- does not have the right to live and work in the UK; or
- is subject to a condition preventing him or her from doing work relating to the carrying on of a licensable activity.

Any premises licence issued in respect of an application made on or after 6 April 2017 will become invalid if the holder ceases to be entitled to work in the UK.

Applicants must demonstrate that they have an entitlement to work in the UK and are not subject to a condition preventing them from doing work relating to the carrying on of a licensable activity. They do this by providing with this application copies or scanned copies of the following documents (which do not need to be certified).

Documents which demonstrate entitlement to work in the UK

West Midlands Police wish to formally submit representations for the Shell Garage, Birmingham Road. Our objections are based on our belief that Shells proposals will not satisfy the Crime and Disorder, Public Nuisance and Public Safety licensing objectives.

Whilst we submit objections, we are trying to work together with the venue.

- The Shell is sandwiched between two CIZs that are a stones throw away. One within the entire city centre
 as defined by the inner ring road and the other on Dudley Street. Both are in existence due to a multitude
 of issues that includes public place violence, public nuisance, anti-social behaviour and drug and alcohol
 misuse.
- The city's night time economy is thriving and a large proportion of the public that travel to and from the city use the main road around the shell as a main route home, many by foot. Furthermore, there are night clubs still open up until 7am such as Starworks in Skinner Street. The fact that the premises is proposing to sell alcohol after 11pm presents a risk, especially during the early hours. Not only will it attract intoxicated members of the public who wish to purchase more alcohol after their night out that could result in disorder or public nuisance to the local residents, it will also attract our homeless community in search of alcohol. Members of this community sleep nearby.
- Shell propose to sell single cans and bottles that links in with the above concerns as does their proposal to sell cider/beer over 6.5% ABV.
- Due to the aforementioned issues/risks, we have declined other similar proposals in the city per se. Whilst this is not a reason for objecting, I wanted to show that our approach is consistent based on risk.
- Comparing this to the recent hearing regarding the Shell Triton, the issues surround the Shell, Birmingham Road are far greater.
