### 1.0 Purpose

1.1 For the Cabinet Members to respond to the questions received:

### a. Recycling

Mr Cyril Baynton:

Recently on 12.02.24, I took a large quantity of newspapers, catalogues, magazines and brochures with a plastic bag of shredded paper to the council tip at Shaw Road. I asked which skip I should use and was given a number which turned out to be "Burnable". Clearly this means that paper taken to a tip is not being recycled.
