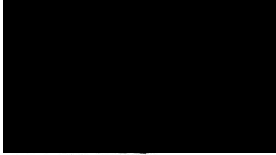

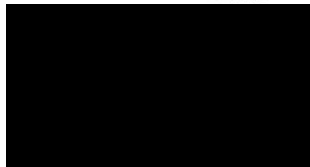
I'd be hugely grateful if you could take this issue seriously and re-consider the application.

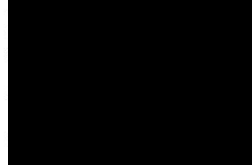

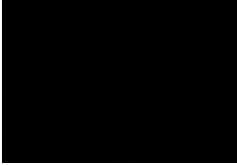

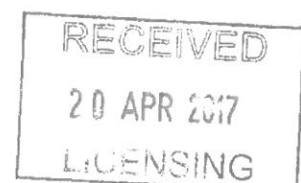
Also there are a number of children who also use the high street. More shops selling alcohol will mean more kids and elderly being pressured by these people.
