Title

NEW CROSS HOSPITAL PUBLIC TRANSPORT FACILITIES

RECOMMENDATION

That the details of the report be received by the Health and Wellbeing board.

1. PURPOSE

- 1.1 To inform the board of the existing public transport facilities serving New Cross Hospital and the continued work to improve public transport accessibility to the site.

2. BACKGROUND

- 2.1 New Cross Hospital is a large facility located in the Heath Town area of the City, a short distance from Wednesfield Village Centre. Employing more than 6,700 staff, the facilities on site provide a range of specialist services not only for the people of Wolverhampton, but also the wider Black Country, South Staffordshire, North Worcestershire and Shropshire. In order for this facility to be utilised to its full potential by patients, visitors and employees from all of these areas, the site needs to be accessible by all modes of transportation, particularly public transport. There are already a significant number of bus services to the hospital site; the attached leaflet which has been produced by Centro outlines the existing public transport facilities serving New Cross Hospital.
- 2.2 Centro has been working with partners to ensure good access to New Cross Hospital for many years. All bus services that run in the West Midlands are provided by private companies and therefore are required to run on a profit making basis. Centro has no powers to force operators to run to specific routes and timetables, but they do work in partnership with the bus companies to try and ensure a level of service across the conurbation that meets passenger needs. Two years ago, through partnership working, Centro secured a number of additional links to the hospital from residential areas, both commercial and subsidised by Centro. Centro currently contributes £457,125 per annum towards the operation of bus services to New Cross Hospital.
- 2.3 New Cross Hospital now has direct public transport links from areas including Wolverhampton, central Walsall, Bloxwich, Pelsall, New Invention, Ashmore Park, Pendeford, Penn, Fordhouses, Low Hill, The Scotlands, Bilston, Rocket Pool, Willenhall, Priestfield and Bradmore. Twelve buses an hour access the hospital grounds during the day and there are four bus stops within the site which provide excellent access to the various services and departments. Along Wolverhampton Road to the front of the hospital, which is within 400m of all the hospital services, an additional 17 buses an hour stop in each direction. Many of these provide direct links from Wolverhampton City Centre.
- 2.4 For people that struggle to use conventional public transport a Ring and Ride service is available which can be used by staff and visitors. The hospital itself also provides a door to door patient transfer service for people with appointments.
- 2.5 Traffic congestion and passenger information around New Cross Hospital have been raised by public transport operators and stakeholders during the Wolverhampton and West Walsall Bus Network Review (July 2011). This was an issue included in the Voluntary Partnership Agreement at the end of the review and subsequently Centro, Wolverhampton City Council and National Express West Midlands have held meetings with representatives from New Cross Hospital to look at a strategy for improving public transport access to the site and enhancing the provision of information and publicity about available services for passengers. These discussions are on-going but there is a desire from all parties to make these improvements.
- 2.6 Wolverhampton City Council are also working with Centro, the hospital and bus companies to identify any highway improvements which could help buses access and continue through the site without suffering from the chronic congestion caused by

queuing cars. Some examples of the options available include bus priority measures on the site tied into the redevelopment proposals, possible Real Time Information (RTI) provision within the site, new stop locations and improving information availability and branding for hospital services. One bus stop has already been relocated to benefit pedestrians and passengers and the hospital has now removed all parking spaces on the hospital road, helping buses to get around the grounds more easily.

- 2.7 Representatives on site at New Cross Hospital have been working with the City Council for some years to develop and implement their Travel Plan to promote sustainable transport use to staff and reduce single occupancy car use. As part of this on-going process, and during phases of future redevelopment on site, enhancements to bus services, information availability and methods of promoting public transport use will continue to be identified and implemented wherever possible.


