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
# Education in Lockdown




#### Background

- We produced a Mentimeter survey that was promoted to Secondary schools over a 5 week period via the Head Teachers Bulletin, and contacts in schools.
- In total 344 young people took part. This is just under 2% of the pupils that attend a secondary school in Wolverhampton.
- Pupils from 16 secondary schools took part in the survey
- The survey was launched at a time when a number of other surveys had been shared with young people such as the Emotional Wellbeing survey which could have impacted on participation.





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## For those young people without technology the experience was very negative.

- I didn't have to complete daily work as I had completed year 11. I did find that assignments sent from sixth form staff were not very clear at all and left me very nervous, I also found that my laptop couldn't keep up with the amount of work I had.
- Struggle to concentrate and learn knowledge... teachers took weeks to respond. Had the right tec but was awful as there is three kids working on one laptop and we couldn't afford another one

- To make sure everyone has right equipment and they know what they are doing
- Don't send work to be printed to people who haven't got printers.
  - hated it work sent via post and had no help from school to complete it

- Did barely any work because we had different websites for different things so it was really confusing

#### What was your experience of education in Lockdown

Responses are summarised into three categories

Positive, Average, Negative.

24% of pupils felt positive about the experience

27% average

49% were negative to the experience

#### What was your experience of home education during lock down like?



A bit different, but enjoyable, the online lessons were very useful but I sometimes felt overworked

I was able to complete the majority of the work however we didn't have much communication from the school.

Better than I thought it was going to be but the work became repetitive and boring towards the end of lockdown

Use lieve it was ok, I found it very hard to complete the work without a teachers guidance and would've preferred it if I had online lessons with my teachers so that it would be easier to complete the work. But overall the teachers did Otheir best.

Fine just didn't have the support of a teacher as much

I did the work

Better than I thought but it was hard to concentrate

I lacked motivation toward the end of the lockdown period, due to the fact that we had no online lessons and a lot of my teachers were even checking my work, so I thought what's the point.

Very challenging. I didn't leave for 16 weeks and was scared of going outside. But made it through to the other side. I am grateful for my teachers and my family.

It was quite strange but became the usual after a while. The only thing that I thought could be improved is the amount of work set since we had to self teach it all and it was hard to do all the work in our set lesson time and I got behind a lot

The work wasn't too hard but they gave us alot more than were used to

It was hard to keep up with all the work and it was lonely having classes without my classmates

Generally, it was hard for me to learn. With limited online lessons and no peers around me I struggled quite a lot as the usual environment to learn in was mainly when speaking and that was more effective than just copying and writing things down.



#### What was your experience of home education during lock down like?



Personally, I think the school handled the situation really well and gave us lots to do. I've heard that many other schools did nothing at all.

The first few months i was on top of it all and had it all handed in but i didn't feel like i was learning anything. And after a couple months it was really difficult to motivate myself and i missed a lot of lessons

It was very hard as I did not receive any communication from teachers other than to send work. It was very mentally draining along with the amount of work set. I was extremely overworked and it was affecting my mental health.

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Once I got into the routine of things, it was generally ok. 
It was very different and quite difficult to keep on track but not too bad once you understand how to do it. It was good as it is as school no difference amazing in other words

Let us talk to the teachers! Emails aren't an effecient way of communicating! If I was stuck I just had to leave it or guess.


Teachers could be more on the ball, my spanish teacher forgot to set work one week, so she set two pieces the next week for the same time. Also some teachers would set work once a month

Smaller Group work to be encouraged


Lessons to be more interactive where possible
