### 1.0 Purpose

1.1 To submit for consideration an application for a review of a premises licence in respect of KS News, 120 Oxford Street, Bilston, Wolverhampton, WV14 7EA

### 2.0 Background

2.1 The current premises licence is attached at Appendix 1.

### 3.0 Review Application

- 3.1 An application was received from Trading Standard on 02 July 2019 for a review of the premises licence in respect of KS News, 120 Oxford Street, Bilston, Wolverhampton, WV14 7EA. The premises are situated in Bilston East ward and a location plan is attached at Appendix 2.
- 3.2 A copy of the review application is attached at Appendix 3. The review has been brought in support of the Prevention of Crime and Disorder licensing objective. Supporting evidence is detailed within the review application.
- 3.3 Representations have been received from the following:
  - West Midlands Police
  - Public Health
  - Licensing Authority

These representations can be found at Appendices 4, 5 and 6.

- 3.4 The notice of review has been properly served on all the Responsible Authorities. The Council has complied with the legislative process and displayed the appropriate notice at the premises and on its website as required, when the application for review was made.
- 3.5 The applicant for review, the current premise licence holder, and those who have made representations have all been invited to attend the review hearing.



On the 8 December 2018 and 23 January 2019, City of Wolverhampton Council Trading Standards received information that illicit cigarettes and tobacco were being sold from K S News and Off Licence, 120 Oxford Street, Bilston. WV14 7EA.
On the 15 February 2019, officers from Trading Standards visited 120 Oxford Street with a Tobacco search dog. On this occasion 9860 cigarette sticks, equivalent to 493 packs were discovered behind the counter, and in a store room.
In addition, 969 Sildenafil Citrate 100mg tablets were discovered in blister packs behind the counter. Although not a classified drug under the Misuse of Drugs Act 1971 (as amended); these products contain the same active ingredient as 'Viagra' used to treat erectile disfunction and are classified as a pharmacy medicine. There were no patient instructions or warnings with the tablets. Sildenafil citrate tablets can have serious side effects. Subsequently on the 25 February 2019, KS News was saued with a written warning by the Medicines & Healthcare Products Regulatory Agency. Pharmacy medicines such as Sildenafil Citrate may only be legally sold or supplied to the public through registered pharmacy premises, by or under the supervision of a pharmacist. KS News has not been given authorisation to sell such neclicines and to continue is a breach of Regulation 255, 214 and 46 of the Human Medicines Regulations 2012.

The tobacco products were suspected his address as of being counterfeit or non duty paid and were subsequently selzed. He was advised during the inspection that it A traders notice was left with was a criminal offence to possess, supply or sell counterfeit products or illicit tobacco products where those goods are marked as duty free or where UK duty has not been paid on those goods. The seized goods included a large number of cigarettes known as 'foreign cheap whites', e.g. FEST, Minsk, and NZ which are foreign brands brought into the UK illegally specifically to be sold on the black market. English branded tobacco products such as KENT, that bore foreign warnings and labelling were seized because they breached UK regulations on packaging and labelling and were non UK DUTY paid. They were manufactured for other domestic markets. Investigations are ongoing as to wherther some of the tobacco products are counterfeit too. To knowingly keep or allow to be kept on relevant premises, goods such as cigarettes, which have been imported without payment of duty or which had otherwise been unlawfully imported is a criminal offence as per section 144 (1) and (3) of the Licensing Act 2003. Trading Standards has "responsible authority" status under the Licensing Act 2003. K S Stores, has engaged in activities which have breached a licensing objective namely the prevention of crime and disorder. The Home Office publishes guidance under section 182 of the 2003 Act and at 11.27 that guidance advises that the sale of contraband or counterfeit tobacco is activity that should be considered "partcularly seriously." The guidance goes on to state that:

"Where reviews arise and the licensing authority determines that the crime prevention objective is being undermined through the premises being used to further crimes, it is expected that suspension or revocation of the licence – even in the first instance should be seriously considered."

Additionally the sale of illicit tobacco:

-contributes to the shadow ecomony

-undermines the City's public health activity which aims to deter residents from smoking especially young people

-drives down the cost of tobacco thereby counteracting Central Government's attempts to use price as a disincentive.





Public Health is not reassured that the business is operating in adherence to the Licensing Act and therefore supports Trading Standards request to review the current licence.

### Application for a review of a premises licence under Licensing Act 2003 KS News, 120 Oxford Street, Bilston, Wolverhampton, WV14 7EA

I write on behalf of the Licensing Authority as a Responsible Authority. I write in support of the above review application made by Trading Standards Service. Representations are made against Crime and Disorder and Public Safety licensing objectives and the failure of the current management of the premises to promote these objectives.

The premises licence holder/DPS, Mr Karanveer Singh has not demonstrated he is operating in accordance with his premises licence and is therefore not promoting the licensing objectives of Crime and Disorder and Public Safety.

The issues raised by trading standards relate to the possession, supply/sale of counterfeit/illicit cigarettes and tobacco at the premises. In addition, a quantity of Sildenafil commonly known as Viagra was also found on the premises. This shows blatant disregard to the licensing objectives by the premises licence holder/DPS.

If Councillors are satisfied that illegal activities have taken place at the premises and are in breach of promoting the licensing objectives, the licensing authority would request the Statutory Licensing Sub-Committee ensure these issues are addressed by considering modification of the current premises licence in accordance with section 52 of the Licensing Act 2003 and paragraphs 11.27 and 11.28 of guidance issued by the secretary of state under 182 of the Act together with City of Wolverhampton Councils Statement of Licensing Policy.

- "11.27 There is certain criminal activity that may arise in connection with licensed premises which should be treated particularly seriously. These are the use of the licensed premises:
  - for the sale and distribution of drugs controlled under the Misuse of Drugs Act 1971 and the laundering of the proceeds of drugs crime;
  - · for the sale and distribution of illegal firearms;
  - for the evasion of copyright in respect of pirated or unlicensed films and music, which does considerable damage to the industries affected;
  - for the illegal purchase and consumption of alcohol by minors which impacts on the health, educational attainment, employment prospects and propensity for crime of young people;
  - for prostitution or the sale of unlawful pornography;
  - by organised groups of paedophiles to groom children;
  - as the base for the organisation of criminal activity, particularly by gangs;
  - for the organisation of racist activity or the promotion of racist attacks;
  - for employing a person who is disqualified from that work by reason of their immigration status in the UK;
  - for unlawful gambling; and
  - for the sale or storage of smuggled tobacco and alcohol.

11.28 It is envisaged that licensing authorities, the police, the Home Office (Immigration Enforcement) and other law enforcement agencies, which are responsible authorities, will use the review procedures effectively to deter such activities and crime. Where reviews arise and the licensing authority determines that the crime prevention objective is being undermined through the premises being used to further crimes, it is expected that revocation of the licence – even in the first instance – should be seriously considered."

Councillors may conclude from the evidence given within the review application and at the hearing in order to promote the licensing objectives of Crime and Disorder and Public Safety that modification of the premises licence or suspension of the licence to ensure the current management of the premises fully understands their roles and responsibilities is not a suitable option and that there is no alternative but to revoke the licence.

The Licensing Authority fully supports the review application brought by Trading Standards Service and concludes the above issues should be resolved in order to promote the licensing objectives of Crime and Disorder and Public Safety.
