2. Association for Public Service Excellence

The Mayor was delighted to report that the City of Wolverhampton Council had won the Overall Council of the Year in Service Delivery for its outstanding work serving residents across the city. The Council also won Best Collaborative Working Initiative for its outstanding work with the P3 Charity.

The i54 programme was a great news for the City with the creation of thousands of jobs, the site had attracted large firms such as Jaguar Land Rover and MOOG. The i54 Western Extension was a site of 60 acres of land, the investment would ensure the site was fully investment ready which would result in additional jobs for the City in addition to other economic objectives.

Unless the Council agrees the recommendation, Councillor John Rowley will cease to be a member of the Council on 15 November 2019.
