**Recommendation for action or decision:**

The Licensing Sub-Committee is requested to consider this application for a new premises licence within the Cumulative Impact Zone.

## 1.0 Purpose of Report

1.1 To submit for consideration by the Sub-Committee an application for a premises licence.

## 2.0 Background

2.1 An application has been received on 9 July 2015 from Slater's Bars Ltd, for a premises licence in respect of Slaters Bar, 41 Queen Street, Wolverhampton WV1 1TX, and a copy of the application is attached at Appendix 1

2.2 The premises are in St Peters ward and a location plan is attached at Appendix 2.

2.3 The application is in respect of regulated entertainment, and the sale/supply of alcohol on the premises, the precise detail of what has been applied for can be found within the operating schedule of the application of the application.

2.6 Slaters bar is situated within the Cumulative Impact Zone. A copy of the policy and area which it covers is attached at Appendix 3.

2.7 The following responsible authorities have been consulted on this application:

- Licensing Authority
- West Midlands Fire Service
- Planning
- Trading Standards
- Social Services
- Local Health Board
- Environmental Health (Commercial)
- West Midlands Police

2.8 The following have all made relevant representations and are objecting to the grant of this application citing the Cumulative Impact Policy and the licensing objectives:

- West Midlands Police
- Licensing Authority
- Environmental Health (Commercial)

Copies of their representations are attached at Appendices 4 - 6

2.9 The applicant, and all who have made representations have been invited to attend the hearing.

## 3.0 Policy Implications

3.1 On 3 April 2015 the Statement of Licensing Policy was revised to give effect to the Cumulative Impact Policy (CIP) in four new areas of the City. This decision supported the view that the number, type and density of premises selling alcohol for consumption and/or Late Night Refreshment in areas within Wolverhampton City was causing problems of nuisance and disorder and therefore causing an adverse impact on the



licensing objectives of prevention of crime and disorder and prevention of public nuisance.

- 3.2 The effect of this CIP is to create a **rebuttable** presumption that applications in respect of the sale or supply of alcohol and/or Late Night Refreshment for new Premises Licences, Club Premises Certificates or Provisional Statements and applications for variations of existing Premises Licences, Club Premises Certificates where the premises are situated in the City Centre Cumulative Impact Zone will be refused.
- 3.3 Essentially this means that applications that are likely to add to the existing cumulative impact will normally be refused, unless the applicant can demonstrate in their operating schedule that there will be no negative cumulative impact on one or more of the licensing objectives. (This policy does not act as an absolute prohibition on granting new licences in the Cumulative Impact Zones).
- 3.4 The premises are situated at 41 Queen Street, Wolverhampton WV1 1TX, which is within the Cumulative Impact Zone.
- 3.5 To rebut the presumption, explained in 3.3 above, the applicant is expected to demonstrate through their operating schedule and where appropriate with supporting evidence that the operation of the premises will not add to the cumulative impact already being experienced and not therefore have an adverse impact in the Licensing Objectives.
- 4.0 **Legal implications**
- 4.1 Part 4(1) of the Licensing Act 2003 states that a Licensing Authority must carry out its function under the Act with a view to promoting the Licensing Objectives, namely:-
- (a) The prevention of crime and disorder;
  - (b) Public safety;
  - (c) The prevention of public nuisance;
  - (d) The protection of children from harm.
- 4.2 The general duties imposed on Licensing Authorities means proper consideration must be given to the Licensing Objectives when determining a premises licence application.
- 4.3 Regard shall be had to guidance issued by the Secretary of State under Section 182 and Wolverhampton City Council's Licensing Policy Statement which includes a Cumulative Impact Policy.
- 4.4 Section 18 of the Licensing Act 2003 provides the Licensing Authority with the power to grant an application, subject to conditions, where appropriate
- 4.5 In order for the Cumulative Impact Policy to be relevant to this application the Sub-Committee

- I. Should be satisfied it applies due to:
  - (a) Premises being located within the Cumulative Impact Zone;
  - (b) Licensable activity applied for at the premises is to include sale of alcohol or late night refreshment and is;
  - (c) The likelihood that the activity will have an impact on the crime and disorder or prevention of public nuisance licensing objectives.

And where the Cumulative Impact Policy is deemed to apply:

- II. Should refuse an application based upon the Cumulative Impact Policy unless sufficient evidence is produced, by the applicant, to rebut the presumption that a licence will not be granted or varied.

4.6 If the Sub-Committee are satisfied sufficient evidence has been produced to show the premises will not add to the Cumulative Impact already being experienced, the application should not be refused based upon Cumulative Impact Policy. [JB06082015T]

## 5.0 Human Rights and Equalities Implications

5.1 This report has human rights implications for both the applicants and the residents from the local neighbourhood. Refusal of a licence may have financial implications for a licensee's business and livelihood whereas granting a licence may have impact upon the day to day lives of residents living in close proximity to the premises.

5.2 Article 8(i) of the European Convention of Human Rights provides that everyone has the right to respect for his/her private and family life and his/her home (which includes business premises). This right may be interfered with by the Council on a number of grounds including the protection of rights and freedoms of others. The First Protocol – Article 1 – also provides that every person is entitled to the peaceful enjoyment of his possessions and shall not be deprived of his possessions except in the public interest and conditions provided for by law. Members must accordingly make a decision which is proportionate to the hearing and endeavour to find a balance between the rights of the applicant, residents and the community as a whole.

5.3 The Public Sector Duty of the Equality Act 2010 also requires the Council to pay due regards (i.e. eliminate discrimination, harassment and victimisation; advance equality of opportunity and foster good relations), in any decisions it undertakes

## 6.0 Financial Implications

6.1 Councillors agreed fees and charges for this function on 21 January 2015; the fees are based on a cost recovery basis. The fee for this application is £190.00, and is non-refundable. [TK/09012015/H]

7.0 **Environmental Implications**

Whilst this premises licence application falls within the Cumulative Impact Zone, by attaching the proposed conditions below, coupled with the vast experience the Applicant has in the Licensed trade the Applicant can satisfy the Licensing Authority that none of the licensing objectives will be undermined. Further it will not add to the current issues within the area. As set out early in this application this is a unique beer bar. The type of premises we intend to operate is modelled on 'The Brew Dog Bars' set up which operate successfully across the country in many cities.

**TO PROMOTE ALL FOUR LICENSING OBJECTIVES WE WILL KEEP:**

Strong management controls and effective training of all staff so that they are aware of the premises licence and the

requirements to meet the four licensing objectives with particular attention to:

a/ no selling of alcohol to underage people

b/ no drunk and disorderly behaviour on the premises area

c/ vigilance in preventing the use and sale of illegal drugs at the retail area

d/ no violent and anti-social behaviour

e/ no harm to children

Documented records of training completed shall be kept for each member of staff. Training shall be regularly refreshed and at no greater than 6 monthly intervals.

Designated premises supervisor confirmed it is obligated to be in day-to-day control of the premises, to provide good training for staff on the Licensing Act (Training Record), to make or authorise each sale

No drink promotions that encourages bulk buying or binge drinking

Red Care alarm system will be installed

As a licensed premises we know that it is necessary to carry out our functions or operate their businesses with a purpose of promoting these objectives. We promise to support these objectives through their operating schedules and other measures (including staff training and qualifications, policies, and strategic partnerships with other agencies). Prior to submitting this application we have consulted with Responsible Authorities and taken on board their views and applied them in this application.

**b) The prevention of crime and disorder**

- CCTV system

The premises shall install and maintain a comprehensive CCTV system. All public areas of the licensed premises including all public entry and exit points, enabling facial identification of every person entering in any light condition. The CCTV cameras shall continually record while the premises is open to the public and recording shall be kept available and unedited for a minimum of 31 day recording, playback, court quality with time and date stamp.

A clear and legible notice outside the premises indicating the normal hours under the terms of the premises licence during which licensable activities are permitted.

Clear and conspicuous notices warning of potential criminal activity, such as theft, that may target customers will be displayed.

Not selling of alcohol to drunk or intoxicated customers.

Custom will not be sought by means of personal solicitation outside or in the vicinity of the premises.

Prevention and vigilance in illegal drug use at the retail unit area.

Staff will be well trained in asking customers to use premises in an orderly and respectful manner.

The use of Door security will be used, for the first 2 weeks, this will be 7 days a week. Following this period SIA door staff will be used on Friday and Saturday evenings 20h00 until 00h30 Also SIA door staff will be used when Wolverhampton Wanderers are playing at home and during occasions when live music takes place. The SIA door staff will be smart and wearing High Vis jackets to ensure they can be identified. There will be a radio link at the premises for security. The DPS shall ensure that the provision of door staff at the premises is appropriate to ensure the safe control of the premises and shall review this on a regular basis. We shall ensure the DPS is present at all Pubwatch meetings and takes an active role in this group.



#### **c) Public safety**

Internal and external lighting fixed to promote the public safety objective.

Well trained staff adherence to environmental health requirements.

Training and implementation of underage ID checks.

A log book or recording system shall be kept upon the premises in which shall be entered particulars of inspections made; those required to be made by statute, and information compiled to comply with any public safety condition attached to the premises licence that requires the recording of such information.

The log book shall be kept available for inspection when required by persons authorised by the Licensing Act 2003 or associated legislation.

All parts of the premises and all fittings and apparatus therein, door fastenings and notices, lighting, heating, electrical, air condition, sanitary accommodation and other installations, will be maintained at all times in good order and in a safe condition.

#### **d) The prevention of public nuisance**

Noise reduction measures to address the public nuisance objective:

Prominent, clear and legible notices will be displayed at the exit requesting the public to respect the needs of nearby residents and to leave the premises and the area quietly.

No noise shall emanate from the premises nor vibration be transmitted through the structure of the

premises that gives rise to a nuisance.

Deliveries of goods necessary for the operation of the business will be carried out at such a time or in such a manner as to prevent nuisance and disturbance to nearby residents.

The Licensee will ensure that staff who arrive early morning or depart late at night (ex. for unpacking, pricing newly delivered goods) when the business has ceased trading conduct themselves in such a manner to avoid causing disturbance to nearby residents.

Customers will be asked not to stand around loudly talking in the street outside the premises.

Customers will not be admitted to premises above opening hours.

The movement of bins and rubbish outside the premises will be kept to a minimum after 11.00pm. This will help to reduce the levels of noise produced by the premises.

Any lighting on or outside the premises will be positioned and screened in such a way so as to not cause a disturbance to nearby residents.

No drinks will be permitted to be taken outside

e) The protection of children from harm

The Challenge 25 scheme must be operated to ensure that any person who appears to be under the age of 25 shall provide documented proof that he/she is over 18 years of age. Proof of age shall only comprise a passport, photo card driving licence, an HM Forces warrant card, or a card bearing the PASS hologram.

"Challenge 25" sign which is a retailing strategy that encourages anyone who is over 18 but looks under 25 to carry acceptable ID (a card bearing the PASS hologram, a photographic driving license or a passport) if they wish to buy alcohol.

Well trained staff about requirement for persons' identification, age establishment etc.

All the details provided in Training Record Book available the retail unit.

Log Book will be kept upon the premises all the time.

Nothing beyond existing Health & Safety requirements

A log shall be kept at the premises to record all refused sales of alcohol for the reasons that the person(s) is/are, or appear(s) to be, under 18 years of age. The log shall record the date and time of the refusal and the name of the member of staff who refused the sale. The log will be available on request by the police or an authorised officer of Wolverhampton City Council.

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## **CUMULATIVE IMPACT POLICY**

It is not proposed to set quotas for particular types of licences. Applications will be considered on their individual merit thus ensuring that the characteristics of the many different types of licensed activity are fully considered. If crime and disorder or general disturbance/nuisance does prove to be linked to the concentration of customers of licensed premises or activities in these or any other particular areas, then it may be necessary to seek controls over the issue of new licences through a 'Cumulative Impact Policy'.

It would first be necessary to establish that, because of the number and density of licensed premises in a particular area, there are exceptional problems of nuisance, disturbance and/or disorder outside or away from those licensed premises as a result of their combined effect. Where particular premises are identifiable as being responsible for the problems, action will be taken against them.

Before deciding whether to adopt a Cumulative Impact Policy, the Council must be sure that the imposition of individual conditions to particular premises would not solve the problem. The Council has a duty under Section 17 of the Crime and Disorder Act 1998 to do all that it reasonably can to prevent crime and disorder.

In the Guidance issued under the Act there are four steps specified to be followed in considering whether to adopt a Cumulative Impact Policy:

- Identification of serious and chronic concern from a responsible Authority or representatives of residents about nuisance or disorder.
- Assessment of causes.
- Where it can be demonstrated that disorder and nuisance is arising as a result of customers of licensed premises, identifying the area from which problems are arising and the boundaries of that area.
- Adopting a policy about future licence applications from that area.

The Licensing Committee will keep any Cumulative Impact Policy under review and modify or remove it, as considered appropriate.

As detailed above the Council recognises that because of the number of and density of licensed premises selling alcohol and/or Late Night Refreshment in particular areas there might be exceptional problems of nuisance, disturbance and/or disorder outside or away from those licensed premises as a result of their combined effect. In these cases it may be necessary to seek controls over the issue of new licences through a 'Cumulative Impact Policy'.

The Licensing Authority is now of the view that in these areas this is causing cumulative impact and designates these areas as Cumulative Impact Zones. The details of the policy specific to each area are described below.

The effect of the Cumulative Impact Policy is to create a **rebuttable** presumption that applications in respect the licensable activities detailed below for new Premises Licences, Club Premises Certificates or Provisional Statements and applications for variations of existing Premises Licences, Club Premises Certificates (where the modifications are relevant to the issue of cumulative impact for example increases in hours or capacity) where the premises are situated in one of the Cumulative Impact Zones will be refused.

To rebut this presumption the applicant would be expected to show through the operating schedule and where appropriate with supporting evidence that the operation of the premises will not add to the cumulative impact already being experienced. This policy does not act as an absolute prohibition on granting new licences in the Cumulative Impact Zones.

The Cumulative Impact Policy will not be used to revoke an existing licence or certificate and will not be applicable to the review of existing licences.

## 1.0 Purpose of Report

1.1 To submit for consideration by the Sub-Committee an application for a review of a premises licence.

## 2.0 Background

2.1 The current premises licence is attached at Appendix 1.

## 3.0 Review Application

3.1 An application was received from West Midlands Police on 9 July 2015 for a review of the premises licence in respect of Prince Albert, Railway Street, Wolverhampton. WV1 1LG. The premises are situated in St Peters ward and a location plan is attached at Appendix 2.

3.2 A copy of the review application is attached at Appendix 3. The review has been brought in support of the Prevention of Crime and Disorder and the Public Safety licensing objectives. Supporting evidence is detailed within the review application.

3.3 Representations have been received from the following:

- Licensing Authority
- Environmental Health [Commercial]

These representations can be found at Appendix 4 and 5

3.4 The notice of review has been properly served on all the Responsible Authorities. The Council has complied with the legislative process and displayed the appropriate notice at the premises and on its website as required, when the application for review was made.

3.5 The applicant for review, the premise licence holder, and those who have made representations have all been invited to attend the review hearing.

## 4.0 Legal Implications

4.1 Section 51 of the Licensing Act 2003, as amended states that a responsible authority or any other person may apply to the relevant Licensing Authority for a review of a licence.

4.2 The Licensing Sub-Committee when determining an application for review, pursuant to Section 52 of the Licensing Act 2003 has power to take any of the following steps (if any) as it considers necessary for the promotion of the "licensing objectives" which are listed at 4.3.

- (a) Modify the conditions of the licence;
- (b) Exclude a licensable activity from the scope of the licence;
- (c) Remove the designated premises supervisor;

- (d) Suspend the licence for a period not exceeding 3 months;
- (e) Revoke the licence.

4.3 The four licensing objectives are:

- The prevention of crime and disorder;
- Public safety;
- The prevention of public nuisance;
- The protection of children from harm.

4.4 In addition, regard shall be had to guidance issued by the Secretary of State under Section 182 of the Licensing Act 2003 and Wolverhampton City Council's Licensing Policy Statement. [JB06082015T]

## 5.0 Human Rights and Equalities Implications

5.1 This report has human rights implications for both the premises licence holder and the residents from the local neighbourhood. Any of the steps outlined in Section 4 of this report may have financial implications for a licensee's business and livelihood and/or may have impact upon the day to day lives of residents living in close proximity to the premises.

5.2 Article 8(i) of the European Convention of Human Rights provides that everyone has the right to respect for his/her private and family life and his/her home (which includes business premises). This right may be interfered with by the Council on a number of grounds including the protection of rights and freedoms of others. The First Protocol – Article 1 – also provides that every person is entitled to the peaceful enjoyment of his possessions and shall not be deprived of his possessions except in the public interest and conditions provided for by law. Members must accordingly make a decision which is proportionate to the hearing and endeavour to find a balance between the rights of the applicant, residents and the community as a whole.

### **Historic permissions consistent with the Justices Licence as converted under the Licensing Act 2003**

#### **Provision of substantial refreshment**

Hot food or hot drinks may be provided in line with alcohol sales with an additional thirty minutes thereafter.

### ***General***

The types of regulated entertainments proposed re-instate and then enhance the normal pub entertainments that were previously unregulated, with the benefit to enhance the local facilities for social entertainment and reduce the focus on alcohol.

No new steps have been identified by my risk assessment in relation to the four licensing objectives, except as below.

I have considered the terms of your local licensing policy in preparing this application.

#### ***Variation granted 05/01/2012***

All existing conditions will also be applied to the 1st Floor.

#### ***The prevention of crime and disorder***

Providing a 60 minute extension of opening hours after the end of the sale of alcohol will promote this objective as the last drink will be consumed less quickly, with access to the pubs toilet facilities.

We will join the local Pub Watch scheme.

#### ***Variation granted 21/11/2013***

We have signed up to the Radio Link and are in the process of purchasing the Scan X ID Scanner.



## ***Public safety***

Function bookings will be limited to 150 persons. My risk assessment identifies no other risk of overcrowding.

## ***The prevention of public nuisance***

Live music will end at 0230 hours

All windows will be kept closed after 2200 hours

## ***Variation granted 21/11/2013***

Specialist sound systems have been installed which are limited and cannot be adjusted. Music volume will be reduced between the hours of 0100 and 0400 and softer music introduced to further reduce the volume and calm crowds before leaving the event at closing time.

## ***The protection of children from harm***

The restrictions set out in the Licensing Act 2003 apply

No unusual risks of harm to children have been identified during daytime hours, however strictly no under 18's after 8pm or when adult entertainment is on.

## **Conditions attached after a hearing by the Licensing Authority**

### ***Variation granted 05/01/2012***

1. On Thursday, Friday and Saturday evening and at any other times where any licensable activity is permitted past 12 midnight, at least two SIA door supervisors to be deployed from 2100 hours until close of business and until every member of the public has left the Premises. Two door staff to be deployed at the entrance of the Premises and at least one female (for searching females) and two door staff on each floor, with a further member of door staff floating between floors as a more visible presence in the Premises.
2. All door staff to be SIA registered, clearly displaying their own badges and wearing high visibility attire.
3. A least one member of SIA registered door staff to be deployed at the external smoking facility.
4. All patrons to be searched on entry or re-entry to the Premises with the use of electric hand wands and random searches to be carried out at the discretion of the Designated Premises Supervisor. All patrons refusing to be searched would have their access to the Premises refused.
5. A strict dress code to be implemented at the Premises, i.e. no tracksuits, baseball caps, hoodies etc. Smart, casual dress only.
6. Challenge 21 to be implemented at the Premises and photograph identification should be produced by anyone who appears to be under the age of 21 and all staff to receive sufficient training in challenging underage drinking. This training is to be documented.
7. No glass drinking vessels or glass bottles to be permitted outside the venue, either out into the street at the front of the Premises or out into the street at the rear of the Premises.
8. Last entry for all patrons into the Premises at 0200 hours, unless in possession of a pre-booked, dated admission ticket allowing access until 0300 hours.
9. All events are to be held at the discretion of the Designated Premises Supervisor (DPS) and/or Premises Licence Holder (PLH) and at least 28 days written notification, consisting of a risk assessment incorporating details of door supervisors DJs/performers and capacity levels, to

be given to the licensing department at Wolverhampton Central Police Station. Police advice received upon the outcome of this risk assessment should always be taken into consideration.

**10.** No events aimed specifically at under 18s to be held prior to authorisation of the Licensing Department at the Wolverhampton Police Station and at least 14 days notice to be given of the event.

**11.** Premises to join the Radio Link Scheme and sign up to the Information Sharing Agreement in conjunction with Wolverhampton City Centre Management (currently known as WV ONE).

**12.** The Designated Premises Supervisor or representative to attend Pubwatch meetings and any customer who behaves inappropriately will be barred from the Premises and their details passed to the Pubwatch Scheme.

**13.** Evidential quality CCTV to be installed and maintained to a high standard, with images/ recordings to be kept for 31 days and to be available upon request by any Responsible Authority. At any time, at least one member of staff to be on duty who can use/ download CCTV on request. CCTV should cover entry and exit points of the Premises and areas where alcohol/ money is served taken and in all areas to which public access and the immediate vicinity outside the Premises. The CCTV system should indicate the correct time and date.

**14.** An incident logbook shall be kept in the Premises, in which will be recorded any incident of crime and disorder. This book will be reviewed by senior management in association with the Designated Premises Supervisor. Any incident of crime and disorder at the Premises shall be reported by a member of staff to the Police as soon as it is reasonably practical to do so.

**15.** All staff who are involved in the sale of alcohol will be fully trained to ensure that no person who is drunk or disorderly or who appears to be under the age of 18 years will be served with intoxicating liquor; such training to be repeated every six months and to be documented.

**16.** An accurate record shall be kept of the number of persons admitted to each part of the Premises; such records to be kept for six months and to be made available to any Responsible Authority.

**17.** All staff to be trained in order to carry out the safe evacuation of the Premises in an emergency and training to be implemented at least annually. A record of this training is to be kept at the Premises and to be made available to any Responsible Authority upon request.

**18.** At least one member of First Aid trained staff to be on the Premises at any time that members of the public are present, to deal with problems associated with alcohol/drugs. If more than one First Aid trained member is on duty then their specific role and responsibilities are to be outlined before their duties commence. Training to be undertaken every six months, to be documented and made available to any Responsible Authority upon request.

**19.** Daily briefing/ tasking to be undertaken for all staff, outlining their responsibilities and any relevant information/policies in relation to the Premises to be documented and provided to any Responsible Authority upon request.

**20.** At least two (four - six if all floors/ beer garden to be open) SIA door staff to be deployed at the Premises when there is a football match at Wolverhampton Wanderers Football Club of a Category C or above. For all other categories it is advisable, but to the discretion of the Designated Premises Supervisor. Police advice should be taken into consideration.

**21.** Facilities shall be provided to enable taxis to be booked/ordered from the Premises.

## **Conditions attached after a hearing by the Licensing Authority**

### ***Variation granted 21/11/2013***

#### Conditions agreed between the West Midlands Police and the Premises Licence Holder

The following conditions will only apply to the outside part of the venue, to be called 'The Arena':

- 1) All events in the Arena are to be held at the discretion of the DPS and/or PLH and at least 28 days written notification, consisting of a risk assessment incorporating details of door supervisors, DJs/performers and capacity levels, to be given to the licensing department at Wolverhampton Central Police Station. Police advice received upon the outcome of this risk assessment should always be taken into consideration.

- 2) Plastic or polycarbonate glasses only to be used for the consumption of beverages whilst in any of the outside areas. No glasses or glass bottles/containers to be permitted under any circumstances in this area, either by staff or customers.
- 3) The premises will be equipped with an ID Scanner which will be utilised as part of the entry requirements for patrons. All patrons to be scanned on first visit. Any patrons refusing to have ID scanned will not be permitted into the venue. Any information stored within the ID Scanner must be made available to any member of a Responsible Authority upon request, or least within 12 hours of request.
- 4) Door supervisors deployed in the Arena area must wear high visibility attire consisting of at least a fluorescent tabard/jacket so that they are easily identified as security staff. Overt wearing of SIA certificates only is not sufficient.
- 5) The capacity level of the Arena area must not exceed the number detailed within the risk assessment for each specific event. Door supervisors deployed in this section must operate clickers to ensure that this level is not exceeded.
- 6) All patrons entering the Arena area will be subject of a search by door supervisors. Any person refusing to be searched will not be permitted in the Arena area.
- 7) The outside area must be covered by CCTV with the following stipulation:
  - CCTV should cover entry and exit points of the Arena area and all areas where alcohol/money is served/taken and all areas to where public have access and the immediate vicinity outside the premise.
  - Images / recordings to be downloaded in a suitable format and provided to any member of a Responsible Authority upon request and without any undue delay.
  - Images and recordings must be of evidential quality, must indicate the correct time and date and be kept for at least 31 days.
  - All staff to be trained to use the CCTV system and at least one member of staff to be on duty who is trained to download the systems images should any member of a Responsible Authority make a request.

Conditions agreed between Environmental Health (Commercial) and the Premises Licence Holder

The following conditions will only apply to the outside part of the venue, to be called 'The Arena':

- 1) Noise/vibration will not emanate from the premises to cause at nuisance at the closest sensitive property.
- 2) Compliance with the noise plan submitted on 21 November 2013 will be set as conditions of your operating schedule.
- 3) All doors and windows in the Prince Albert building must remain closed when regulated entertainment takes place, except to allow for access and egress.
- 4) No licensable activity will take place outdoors on a Monday to Thursday except on all Bank Holidays (including bank Holiday Mondays), Valentine's Day, Easter Monday, Halloween, Bonfire night, Christmas Eve, Christmas Day, New Year's Eve, New Year's Day.
- 5) All recorded and Live music will be reduced after 0100 hours. Sound limiter equipment must be used on **all** sound producing equipment used at all events to ensure noise and

vibration from the licensable activities does not cause a nuisance at the closest sensitivity properties.

- 6) All recorded and live music in the outside area will terminate at 0200 hours with the exception of any background entertainment and a maximum of two outdoor events in the arena area per calendar month.
- 7) Regular patrols, by a responsible person, will be undertaken of the surrounding area of the external area of the premises to ensure that the entertainment at the premises or noise from patrons outside the premises is at a level not to cause a nuisance to residents living in the vicinity of the premises. Patrols will be undertaken at least twice each day/night regulated entertainment takes place.
- 8) Should the DPS or Premises licence holder be notified of any justified noise complaints action must be taken immediately to reduce the level of music and or vibration to the satisfaction of the investigating Officer.
- 9) The surface of the lower arena area will be resurfaced prior to are being used, so as to provide a sound, safe, even surface for patrons

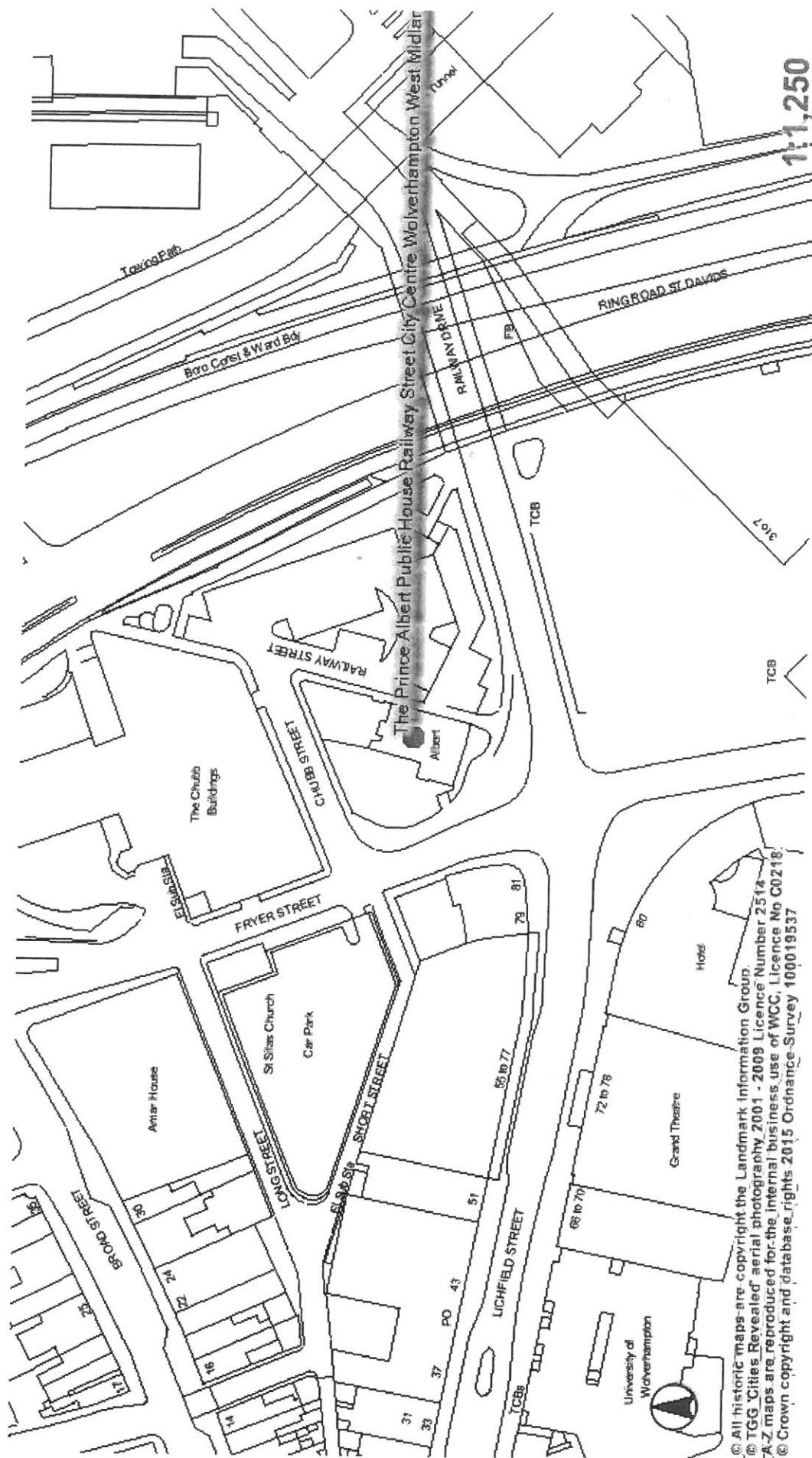
Further to the above specific conditions the following recommendations are made:

Police are defined as a 'Responsible Authority' under the Licensing Act 2003 and as such have statutory obligation to ensure that licensed premises comply with the requirements of the Act and the operating schedule relating to that premise.

The 'Prince Albert' venue is situated on Railway Drive, Wolverhampton. It is an inner city centre property, which has a large patron capacity. The hours of trading are Monday to Sunday 08.00 -07.00, alcohol sales are between 10.00 and 06.00.

The premises licence holder is 'Richard Ryan Limited' of Stourbridge Dudley Miss Sarah Hughes is the DPS, she has been in post since the 9<sup>th</sup> February this year, however, she has been an employee of the venue for a considerable time in a managerial role prior to taking the position of DPS.

Miss Hughes holds a personal licence, number DY502795, issued by Dudley Borough Council. Please note there is no suggestion within this application that the DPS Ms Hughes is inadequate. She is the third DPS in the last 18 months and by far the most competent to date. Police have a good working relationship with her and do not seek her replacement.

During the course of 2014 the venue experienced issues which culminated in an action plan proposed by the venue being submitted to Police dated the 29<sup>th</sup> June 2014.

Many issues concerned police from door entry issues, no id scanner, the DPS in place at the time Mr Bella, reported after hours drinking and drug taking at the venue. The concerns had been discussed at meetings held on Feb 21<sup>st</sup>, 7<sup>th</sup> March 25<sup>th</sup> April 2 June. As a result the venue supplied an action plan dated 29<sup>th</sup> July 2014. Meeting also took place on the 2<sup>nd</sup> July and 15<sup>th</sup> July. (***found at Appendix 1***)

By the latter part of 2014 the venue was yet again the focus of Police concerns. An intelligence log dated 11<sup>th</sup> August 2014 had been received to Police which suggested; ***The bar staff are selling Ecstasy and a certain nominal was linked to the premises and has a vested financial interest in the premises and the circulation of drugs.*** (***found at appendix 2***).

A licensing Police Officer who visited the venue on a Monday lunchtime found this individual in the grounds of the premises with management and DJ staff. The male gave false details to the officer in the presence of the manager and house DJ. This heightened the Police concerns the integrity of the staff and the association with the male. The venue staff assured Police the male was not involved in the venue or the running of it and offered a shut down and rebranding to reassure Police concerns.

**Partnership work started again with the venue as follows;**

On the 30<sup>th</sup> November at 03.50 hours, Police officers on patrol were flagged down at the venue where a male was in possession of a knife and a quantity of drugs, (which he swallowed). (***Log number 527 found at appendix 3***)

Police and DPS Sarah Hughes met on the 5<sup>th</sup> December to discuss this incident and recommended a knife arch for the venue should be introduced and was now a **serious consideration. The venue stated that they had searched the male but he had looked 'shifty' and then had dropped a knife. The venue suggested submitting a new**

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action plan but stated they could not afford a knife arch. (*interview notation found at appendix 4*).

On the 7<sup>th</sup> December at 03.15 hours in the morning outside the venue, there was a report of a male been ejected from the premises, leaving but then returning with a knife. (*Log number 408 found at appendix 5*)

On the 8<sup>th</sup> December a meeting was held to discuss the necessity of the knife arch and Police requested a knife arch be implemented as soon as possible. (*interview notation found at appendix 6*).

On the 19<sup>th</sup> December a meeting was held with the venue staff. (*interview notation found at appendix 7*).

Present were the DPS at the present time 'Mr Tagn McGillicuddy', 'Mr Ryan McGillicuddy', (who we believed to be the Premise Licence holder) the manager Sarah Hughes the licensing Police Inspector and two licensing Police officers. Police highlighted concerns regarding the level of incidents over the later months of 2014. The purpose of the meeting was to engage in partnership working with the venue in order to address measures to meet the licensing objectives of prevention of crime and disorder and public safety.

1) Police stated it was apparent the current DPS (Mr Tagn McGillicuddy) was not a presence at the venue, and, had not taken part in the day to day running of the premises for some time.

Police suggested the manager Sarah Hughes was a more appropriately placed person for the position of DPS due to her daily attendance and running of the venue. Police had been assured on numerous occasions Ms Hughes intended to take this position but there had been delays in her application process.

2) The C.C.T.V had been found to be non-evidential in the Licensing Officers opinion, in that it did not hold facial images of the patrons as they entered the venue. The camera was positioned in such a manner that the entrance door had only an 'overview' of the patrons entering the venue, (the camera was placed on a high vantage position and was obtaining images of patrons from above their head height.) Assurances were given that the position of the entrance camera would be moved before the Christmas and New year holiday period.

3) A knife arch was again discussed however, the venue did not wish to proceed with the purchase of a knife arch stating that they believed 'searching mitts' would be more preferable. They acknowledged a measure was necessary and produced an invoice for 'searching mitts' which was given over as proof of intent to buy.

The venue staff cited a desire to move to a better clientele at the venue and stated that they did not wish to go with the knife arch due to image perception. The venue stated they were changing to a better clientele and that these present issues would not be a problem once the patronage changed.

These assurances echoed assurances made earlier in 2014 which had not proved effective and had led to this interaction partnership working.

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There was an assurance to remove marquees in the grounds and rebrand as soon as possible. It is to be noted the venue had already closed in autumn of 2014 following the Police concerns around the Urban Street Gang nominal who was connected to the venue. It closed redecorated and 'rebranded'. The venue agreed to close again and rebrand after the Christmas holiday period. The venue discussed financial restraints.

The following specific conditions were discussed in terms of the rebranding exercise.;

- 1) Dress code – The venue stated that they had already addressed this.
- 2) Events – a request that the 'condition' to give clarification to Police for events was adhered to in order to ensure up to date intel could be provided to the venue.
- 3) Pub watch – attendance was a condition and should be adhered to.
- 4) Incident logs – these should be consistent and accurate.
- 5) I.D scanner – this 'condition' of the licence was still not in place, venue staff stated they would purchase and utilise one.
- 6) CCTV - to be evidential and positioned appropriately.

On New Year's Eve 2014, (some twelve days after the last meeting), the 'Prince Albert' had three incidents occur at the venue.

1) The venue reported over the link radio that a female patron had been assaulted in the venue. She had been bitten on the nose and face, dragged to the floor and stamped on her body and head by the offender numerous times. The offender was identified and officers attended and dealt with the offender. **(Log number 2132 found at appendix 8)**

\* The Police Duty Inspector had indicated at 01.25 hours that he believed the venue should consider closing. **(Log number 325 found at appendix 9)**

2) Incident occurred at 01.25 hours New Year's Day. A large group were refused entry into the venue and caused disorder before leaving. The venue asked for Police assistance in moving the group on. Their incident report states the group were verbally aggressive and threatening and they believed Police were required to move the group on for safety of the patrons in the venue. **(venue report form timed at 01.30 found at appendix 10)**

3) The incident occurred at 03.30 hours New Year's Day and required Police attendance and assistance to remove the problem element along, a member of the venue staff called the incident in and stated 6/8 aggressive males at the doors assaulting the door staff, fighting, weapons seen. **(Log number 863 found at 11 & 864 found at appendix 12)**

The Police Sergeant who attended has given a statement stating that when he attended the venue he would describe it as having a 'tense atmosphere' with a number of patrons giving off a 'macho' bravado. The DPS was therefore advised to close the venue. **(Police Sergeant Statement found at appendix 13).**

\*The venues report of the night and the incident at 03.40 stated they felt the club suffered minimal issues that evening **(venue report form timed at 03.40 found at appendix 14)**



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Intelligence log dated the 9<sup>th</sup> January stated the group trying to gain entry were members of the Urban Street Gang the 'HeathTown Crew' (*Intel log found at appendix 15*)

Police Licensing received an email on the 14<sup>th</sup> January 2015 from the venue stating they would now be providing their own chosen door team in place of the current team as they stated they "had been having issues with the "head doorman". It is to be noted at the time **Freedom Security** were in place. This company is still the door company for the venue and attended the most recent meeting with venue staff and Police on the 18<sup>th</sup> June. They acknowledged the action plan still had not been submitted due to computer error issues, but that the scanner would be now be implemented. They stated they intended to close again for rebranding at the end of February 2015. (*email found at appendix 16*)

On the 16<sup>th</sup> January an email was received with the proposed action plan that had been requested at the meeting of the 19/12/14. They stated they intended to vary the licence as it was outdated for their venue. The email stated the search mitts were in now being used, C.C.T.V now had facial images with no obstructions, and a 'ID' scanner 'app' was now being utilised. (*email found at appendix 17*)

On the evenings' trading of the 15<sup>th</sup> March 2015 a fight occurred between 7 males at the venue at 02.53 hours. A member of the venues' staff called 999.

Police Officers placed an entry upon log number 315 which detailed their attendance to this 999 call. The entry upon the log at 03.18 hours states there is a large group but that no one at the location was engaging with Police. There is little information surrounding this incident detailed on the Police Log this was possibly due to the non-engagement from the venue. (*Log numbers 315 found at appendix 18*)

The submitted incident report from the venue for this incident was of 'very poor quality' it merely outlined the incident as 3 men removed for 'misbehaving', and then once outside had then disagreed with 2 other males which escalated the incident into a brawl. CTV was not provided by the venue with the report. Police were called to assist with this incident.. (*submitted incident report found at appendix 19*)

As such a further discussion took place between Police and the venue to address this matter and the poor incident log report. It is to be mentioned that the action plan submitted by the venue in July 2014 had stated '**a written log will be compiled each week in a spread sheet format, consisting of each evenings event and any incidents which will correlate with CCTV to be sent over weekly**'.

The venue later re submitted the incident report with far more detail in it, stating that the males left the venue after apologising for an incident inside but then became

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involved in a further disagreement outside with one male sustaining a nose bleed. The detail in the second incident report, ie, offenders descriptions, and injuries to patrons, was clearly missing from the first submitted report. ***(submitted incident report found at appendix 20)***

Police licensing can confirm that in the interim period since March 2015 the venue have not reported incidents which have occurred at the venue to the licensing department.

Police have however the following reports to incident desks;

***These logs are included to demonstrate the demand the venue places regularly upon emergency resources.***

1) Disorder log - 5<sup>th</sup> April - 01.51hours – Via the link radio the venue asking for a male to be removed, officers attended and removed male. ***(Log 253 found at appendix 21)***

\*Email from venue 5/4/15 with incident report attached but the file would not down load, email to venue from Police asking for report in readable format. Still awaiting details to date. ***(found at appendix 22)***

2) Disorder Log – 12<sup>th</sup> April – 01.42 hours - reported by a Police Officer – arresting male at the location for drunk and disorderly. ***(found at appendix 23)***

3) Ambulance log – 19<sup>th</sup> April – 02.53 - Ambulance Responder in attendance, male having taken MDMA ( Ecstasy) ***(found at appendix 24)***

4) Disorder 26<sup>th</sup> April - 02.19 hours – Fight outside the venue officers despatched, upon arrival all parties have left. ***(found at appendix 25)***

5) Disorder 16<sup>th</sup> may – 00.47 – 2 males fighting outside, immediate Police response, nothing found upon arrival. ***(found at appendix 26)***

6) Ambulance log – 17<sup>th</sup> May - 00.06 male has had a fit, taken to hospital***(found at appendix 27)***

7) Ambulance log – 25<sup>th</sup> May – 01.45 female intoxicated, possibly drink spiked, taken to hospital. ***(found at appendix 28)***

***The two logs below are the knife assault incident of the 14/6/15***

8) Disorder – 14<sup>th</sup> June 04.08 – Anonymous caller stating 'fighting - 'with bottles ***(log 474 found at appendix 29)***

9) Disorder – 14<sup>th</sup> June 05.46 – casualty at Walsall Hospital reporting male presented with stab wound to neck. \* Please see below for full details\* ***(log 568 found at appendix 30) This is a twenty one page log and has had sensitive information removed from it for the purposes of the hearing***

10) Disorder – 28<sup>th</sup> June – 02.00 Male has been ejected from venue - has struggled with door staff – taken to hospital believed to have taken 3 Ecstasy tablets. ***(log 387 found at appendix 31)***

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The incident on Sunday 14<sup>th</sup> June 2015 is detailed below;

On this date the venue was open to trade to the public.  
We are also aware that a birthday party was taking place and guests for the party were in the premises.

No prior notification of the birthday party booking had been provided to the Police licensing department.  
Police note that there is a condition placed upon the licence which specifies; '28 days' notice of all 'events' with risk assessment, details of door supervisors, DJ's, performers and capacity levels should to be given to the licensing department at Wolverhampton Central Police Station'.  
The venue will state that this was merely a booth booked out to a party which is normal practice at the venue and does not constitute an event which they need to inform Police of.

Also noted in the venue's licence is a condition to purchase an I.D. scanner. We can see a scanner in use but the female who appears to operate the scanner is not always present. As a result not all patrons were scanned into the venue that evening.

In the early hours of the following morning at 05.46 hours a male presented at Walsall Manor Hospital, with a knife wound to his neck.  
After surgery he cited the location of the assault upon his person to be the Prince Albert Pub, Wolverhampton.  
The victim was a patron of the venue that night and was a guest of the birthday party that was taking place.  
He has stated that males surrounded him inside the washroom of the venue and conducted an unprovoked attack upon him.  
As a result the victim then left the premises. He is seen to leave and speak to the female door staff as he goes.  
Once outside the victim and his friend do not leave the area and appear to loiter. There are numerous members of the public around including the venue's DJ.  
The door is still being operated to allow patrons out of the venue and the interior camera will place the female door staff at this door.

The offenders leave the venue through this door shortly afterwards and the two parties have a confrontation directly outside the venue entrance.

It is here, less than four metres from the entrance to the venue, that the victim is stabbed to his neck with a what is believed to be a bladed instrument, The victim was in surgery for several hours. A male from the group is also seen clutching an upturned glass bottle and a threatening/defensive manner.

This investigation is a live on-going police matter at the time of writing and offenders are sought by Police.



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CCTV footage retrieved from the Prince Albert venue will show the incident occurring. CCTV footage times are 'considerably out' in relation to the correct time, Facial imaging now on the CCTV has allowed stills of offenders to be utilised to assist in the investigation.

The outside camera is approximately 1 hour later than the actual time and the interior camera is approximately 1 hour slower than the actual time meaning the cameras are approximately 2 hours out of sync with each other.

This has made the viewing of footage to investigate this matter extremely frustrating. The ID scanner, although in use, has some poor images and repeated images of patrons. CCTV will show that not all patrons were scanned in.

We note with grave concern that the female door staff is not seen to be active in this incident even though she is in close proximity. She is not responsive nor does she report the matter later to Police. We have no account from this staff member as to why she is not seen to deal with this incident. We clearly see members of staff come from inside the venue who **would** have walked past her to see what is going on outside.

One staff member sees the droplets of blood on the pavement from the victim's neck wound and puts his hand to his mouth. Another staff member also comes out to assess the incident. Both staff males return inside the venue and go back to sweeping up.

Numerous members of the public are clearly aware of the incident and are watching it from inside the venue fencing the female door staff member is less than two metres from them.

No report is received from the venue, however an anonymous member of the public calls the police. Police attend.

The staff who have been identified as going out to look at the incident and blood are seen to speak with the Police Inspector in attendance.

The Police Inspector who attends has given an evidential statement to confirm he spoke to staff who told him they had not called Police, and that they did not know why Police had been called and that everything was fine. (*statement found at appendix 32*)

Four days later on 18<sup>th</sup> June venue staff management and door team management all attended Bilston Street Police station to discuss this incident. They all stated they had no knowledge of the incident prior to the Police contacting them to secure evidence following the injured male going to hospital. (*notation of meeting found at appendix 33*)

Police are happy that from CCTV you can see members of venue staff were aware of this incident. We are not clear why the venue staff have not reported this to the management team.

If it is that management were not made aware by staff then this is a real issue for the venue in terms of public safety.



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In addition, intelligence received by Police over the period of concern from summer 2014 to the present day, raises concerns as to a staff association with drugs being taken/supplied from the venue and Gang attendance.

It is important to say that intelligence logs listed below are from sources which are classed as 'E4 intelligence'.

This means the information could have come from several places such as 'anonymous callers', 'crime stoppers calls', 'individuals telling Police officers information. Therefore, Police consider them as from an 'untested source', in that we cannot judge if they are true or false.

Below are further intelligence logs Police have received which raise concerns. Some of the intelligence is very recent. These are

- 1) 3<sup>rd</sup> Sept 14 - Drug dealing is taking place on the top floor of the Prince Albert **(found at appendix 34)**
- 2) 5<sup>th</sup> Dec 14 – A girlfriend of a Urban Street Gang nominal had a fight with another female inside the venue. **(notation of meeting found at appendix 35)**
- 3) 9<sup>th</sup> Jan 15 – Urban Street Gang 'The Heath Town Crew' are the group that attended the Prince Albert Pub on News Year's Eve, were refused entry and kicked the door down and pushed their way into the venue with force. Door staff were observed wearing stab proof vests. **(intel log found at appendix 15 earlier in the papers)**
- 4) 12<sup>th</sup> June 15 – Prince albert are knowingly allowing drug dealers onto the premises because they receive a cut of the sale of the drugs **(intel log found at appendix 36)**
- 5) 15<sup>th</sup> June 15 - Staff are allowing drugs to be taken at the premises staff members have been seen snorting coke (cocaine). Drugs **(intel log found at appendix 37)**

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Concerns which have focused around the venue now cover a long period of time, from the action plan detailed at 29<sup>th</sup> June 2014, to the present day.

The Police have conducted meetings, phone calls, emails and many hours of partnership work, but feel that this methodology is failing to ensure public safety and prevent crime and disorder at the venue.

As recently as Friday 26<sup>th</sup> June the venue was indebted to the radio link company for £390.00. This payment had to be made before the venue received the radio link facility back from the B.I.D partnership group.

Police are always concerned when such a vital piece of equipment is a cost concern to the venue. We seek to highlight this is licence condition. The radio link company have allowed the venue to retain the system even though money was outstanding.

We are told that the radio is now in place but it is obviously a consideration that there is a nod to financial constraints in terms of measures implemented at the venue. The radio link system links the Prince Albert to other venues in the night time economy in Wolverhampton and Police believe it to be essential and is a condition of the licence. *(email from B.I.D. company to venue at appendix 38)*

Further concerns to be noted are that Police are unsure as to how much knowledge 'Mr Richard Bourne' has to incidents at, and the running of, 'The Prince Albert' venue.

Mr Bourne is now the sole director of 'Richard Ryan Limited' the Premises Licence Holder company.

Police were aware at some point last year that Mr Bourne had been very poorly and was not involved in the day to day running of the venue .

This in itself was not an issue as a close working relationship had been formed with Mr Ryan McGillicuddy of Richard Ryan Limited, who we believed to be a director of 'Richard Ryan Limited'.

Police were recently surprised to find Mr Ryan McGillicuddy resigned as a director of this company on the 15<sup>th</sup> April 2014. He failed to disclose this in any of the partnership meetings at the latter part of 2014 into 2015 and moreover submitted an application relating to the premises dated as recently as 23<sup>rd</sup> April 2015 citing himself as a director for Prince Albert. This was a hand written application so it was not a standard computerised form on which this information has been submitted in error. *(table and chairs application form from Mr Ryan McGillicuddy at appendix 39)*

At the last meeting with the venue management on the 18<sup>th</sup> June this year, Mr Ryan McGillicuddy conceded this was the case, when he was asked who review papers would be addressed to for this matter. He stated that he is still a partner in the business but not a director. He is not therefore the Premises Licence Holder.

On Thursday 2nd July the DPS Miss Sarah Hughes attended and watched footage of the stabbing incident on CCTV and answered questions relating to the footage under caution.

When questioned as to the actions of the door woman and the staff members, in not dealing/not reporting to Police/ not reporting to management, she stated we would have to ask her staff as she could offer no reasoning to their actions. *(interview notes of the DPS watching the cctv footage at appendix 40)*

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The CCTV footage of the incident of 14<sup>th</sup> June will be available to watch if required at any hearing set.

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Please provide as much information as possible to support the application. West Midlands Police are gravely concerned due to the serious nature of the recent incident .

The DPS states she had no knowledge of the incident prior to contact from Police the following day, and licensing can confirm that the department has conducted an interview in which Ms Hughes states she did not have this incident reported to her by her staff. Police are not suggesting that Ms Hughes knew of this incident .

As it is now evidenced that staff clearly had knowledge of some sort of incident we are concerned that no report was made to her or any other member of the management team or to Police.

This may then have compromised a crime scene which may have been of serious consequence. Police raise concerns as to the effectiveness of the running of the venue and public safety at the location from further crime and disorder when there is such poor communication between the venue staff to their own management and to Police.

Reassurances have been provided many times to Police over the last twelve months with the commencement of two action plans, two periods of rebranding, changes of staff, replacing of door staff, and replacement of DPS. This has failed to resolve incidents of disorder and moreover the use of weapons. Measures which appear to be stringent are still failing to control matters of serious incident at the premises, and are un-enforceable.

West Midlands Police are in support of local and independent businesses such as the 'The Prince Albert', however we cannot continue to support this venue when there is a lack of understanding and noncompliance of licensing objectives within the licensing legislation. The venue management will state that they believe they are already doing all they can to meet the licensing objectives of public safety and prevention of crime and disorder.

If it is truly the case that the venue itself cannot identify any other measures which can ensure these licensing objectives, Police have no option than to seek the revocation of the Prince Albert Licence in order to prevent further serious offences occurring, and ensure the safety of the public. If revocation is not considered Police would seek to ensure the premises places stringent measures in and around the venue in order to prevent further incidents of crime, particularly involving weapons.

**We have major concerns over the vulnerability of the perimeter of the venue. The search that was conducted on the offender was not altogether thorough but was conducted. We fear weapons/drugs could easily be passed through the perimeter fencing of the venue to a patron even if they had been thoroughly searched upon entry.**

The Prince Albert has open fencing all around its footprint, therefore, unlike other venues with an entrance door, (where searching and knife arches can be static) any implement/substances can be passed through the fencing into the venue. The venue management have stated they too have concerns as to how a weapon could have entered the premises on the night of the wounding and feel their searching is adequate. Police will state that there is currently no assurance that a weapon could not just simply be passed through the fencing.

A potential solution to combat this vulnerability would be to not hold outside events on the terrace area after 21.00 hours. This would ensure all patrons were searched and then remained inside the premises during operational hours. A solid fence would not resolve this as items could be thrown over.

Any patrons already at the venue on the terrace prior to night time operation would be required to re-enter the premise at 21.00 hours via the knife arch and be subject to the door search policy and the terrace to be closed from 21.00 hours onwards.

We would seek to implement a static knife arch at the single point of entry to be used in conjunction with the search mitts.

A 100% search policy to be implemented and an emptying of all pockets/handbags into a bowl before passing through the knife arch, any indication of metal from the knife arch to be further investigated by the search mitts.

Anyone refusing to abide by the door entry search policy to not be admitted to the venue.

The venue is a late night venue which allows a longer period of alcohol consumption and this can be considered to be a contributing factor to persons utilising weapons with such disregard to the potential ramifications. We would request that the supply of alcohol till 06.00 be reduced to 03.00 hours with a last entry of 01.30 hours.

We would ask that a better ID scanner be implemented at the premises as the ID scanner currently being used has duplicated, obtained poor images and is subject to operator error or none use.

Police Seek to ensure the safety of all members of the public and staff of this venue to be paramount. Our intention is prevent further crime and disorder at the venue and promote positive venue and Police interaction for the future if the licence is retained.

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

4. All patrons to be searched on entry or re-entry to the Premises with the use of electric hand wands and random searches to be carried out at the discretion of the Designated Premises Supervisor. All patrons refusing to be searched would have their access to the Premises refused.
5. A strict dress code to be implemented at the Premises, i.e. no tracksuits, baseball caps, hoodies etc. Smart, casual dress only.
6. Challenge 21 to be implemented at the Premises and photograph identification should be produced by anyone who appears to be under the age of 21 and all staff to receive sufficient training in challenging underage drinking. This training is to be documented.
7. No glass drinking vessels or glass bottles to be permitted outside the venue, either out into the street at the front of the Premises or out into the street at the rear of the Premises.
8. Last entry for all patrons into the Premises at 0200 hours, unless in possession of a pre-booked, dated admission ticket allowing access until 0300 hours.
9. All events are to be held at the discretion of the Designated Premises Supervisor (DPS) and/or Premises Licence Holder (PLH) and at least 28 days written notification, consisting of a risk assessment incorporating details of door supervisors DJs/performers and capacity levels, to



be given to the licensing department at Wolverhampton Central Police Station. Police advice received upon the outcome of this risk assessment should always be taken into consideration.

10. No events aimed specifically at under 18s to be held prior to authorisation of the Licensing Department at the Wolverhampton Police Station and at least 14 days notice to be given of the event.

15. All staff who are involved in the sale of alcohol will be fully trained to ensure that no person who is drunk or disorderly or who appears to be under the age of 18 years will be served with intoxicating liquor; such training to be repeated every six months and to be documented.

16. An accurate record shall be kept of the number of persons admitted to each part of the Premises; such records to be kept for six months and to be made available to any Responsible Authority.

17. All staff to be trained in order to carry out the safe evacuation of the Premises in an emergency and training to be implemented at least annually. A record of this training is to be kept at the Premises and to be made available to any Responsible Authority upon request.

18. At least one member of First Aid trained staff to be on the Premises at any time that members of the public are present, to deal with problems associated with alcohol/drugs. If more than one First Aid trained member is on duty then their specific role and responsibilities are to be outlined before their duties commence. Training to be undertaken every six months, to be documented and made available to any Responsible Authority upon request.

19. Daily briefing/ tasking to be undertaken for all staff, outlining their responsibilities and any relevant information/policies in relation to the Premises to be documented and provided to any Responsible Authority upon request.

20. At least two (four - six if all floors/ beer garden to be open) SIA door staff to be deployed at the Premises when there is a football match at Wolverhampton Wanderers Football Club of a Category C or above. For all other categories it is advisable, but to the discretion of the Designated Premises Supervisor. Police advice should be taken into consideration.

21. Facilities shall be provided to enable taxis to be booked/ordered from the Premises.

## **Conditions attached after a hearing by the Licensing Authority**

### ***Variation granted 21/11/2013***

#### Conditions agreed between the West Midlands Police and the Premises Licence Holder

The following conditions will only apply to the outside part of the venue, to be called 'The Arena':

- 1) All events in the Arena are to be held at the discretion of the DPS and/or PLH and at least 28 days written notification, consisting of a risk assessment incorporating details of door supervisors, DJs/performers and capacity levels, to be given to the licensing department at Wolverhampton Central Police Station. Police advice received upon the outcome of this risk assessment should always be taken into consideration.



- 2) Plastic or polycarbonate glasses only to be used for the consumption of beverages whilst in any of the outside areas. No glasses or glass bottles/containers to be permitted under any circumstances in this area, either by staff or customers.
- 3) The premises will be equipped with an ID Scanner which will be utilised as part of the entry requirements for patrons. All patrons to be scanned on first visit. Any patrons refusing to have ID scanned will not be permitted into the venue. Any information stored within the ID Scanner must be made available to any member of a Responsible Authority upon request, or least within 12 hours of request.
- 4) Door supervisors deployed in the Arena area must wear high visibility attire consisting of at least a fluorescent tabard/jacket so that they are easily identified as security staff. Overt wearing of SIA certificates only is not sufficient.
- 5) The capacity level of the Arena area must not exceed the number detailed within the risk assessment for each specific event. Door supervisors deployed in this section must operate clickers to ensure that this level is not exceeded.
- 6) All patrons entering the Arena area will be subject of a search by door supervisors. Any person refusing to be searched will not be permitted in the Arena area.
- 7) The outside area must be covered by CCTV with the following stipulation:
  - CCTV should cover entry and exit points of the Arena area and all areas where alcohol/money is served/taken and all areas to where public have access and the immediate vicinity outside the premise.
  - Images / recordings to be downloaded in a suitable format and provided to any member of a Responsible Authority upon request and without any undue delay.
  - Images and recordings must be of evidential quality, must indicate the correct time and date and be kept for at least 31 days.
  - All staff to be trained to use the CCTV system and at least one member of staff to be on duty who is trained to download the systems images should any member of a Responsible Authority make a request.

Conditions agreed between Environmental Health (Commercial) and the Premises Licence Holder

The following conditions will only apply to the outside part of the venue, to be called 'The Arena':

- 1) Noise/vibration will not emanate from the premises to cause at nuisance at the closest sensitive property.
- 2) Compliance with the noise plan submitted on 21 November 2013 will be set as conditions of your operating schedule.
- 3) All doors and windows in the Prince Albert building must remain closed when regulated entertainment takes place, except to allow for access and egress.
- 4) No licensable activity will take place outdoors on a Monday to Thursday except on all Bank Holidays (including bank Holiday Mondays), Valentine's Day, Easter Monday, Halloween, Bonfire night, Christmas Eve, Christmas Day, New Year's Eve, New Year's Day.
- 5) All recorded and Live music will be reduced after 0100 hours. Sound limiter equipment must be used on **all** sound producing equipment used at all events to ensure noise and

vibration from the licensable activities does not cause a nuisance at the closest sensitivity properties.

- 6) All recorded and live music in the outside area will terminate at 0200 hours with the exception of any background entertainment and a maximum of two outdoor events in the arena area per calendar month.
- 7) Regular patrols, by a responsible person, will be undertaken of the surrounding area of the external area of the premises to ensure that the entertainment at the premises or noise from patrons outside the premises is at a level not to cause a nuisance to residents living in the vicinity of the premises. Patrols will be undertaken at least twice each day/night regulated entertainment takes place.
- 8) Should the DPS or Premises licence holder be notified of any justified noise complaints action must be taken immediately to reduce the level of music and or vibration to the satisfaction of the investigating Officer.
- 9) The surface of the lower arena area will be resurfaced prior to are being used, so as to provide a sound, safe, even surface for patrons

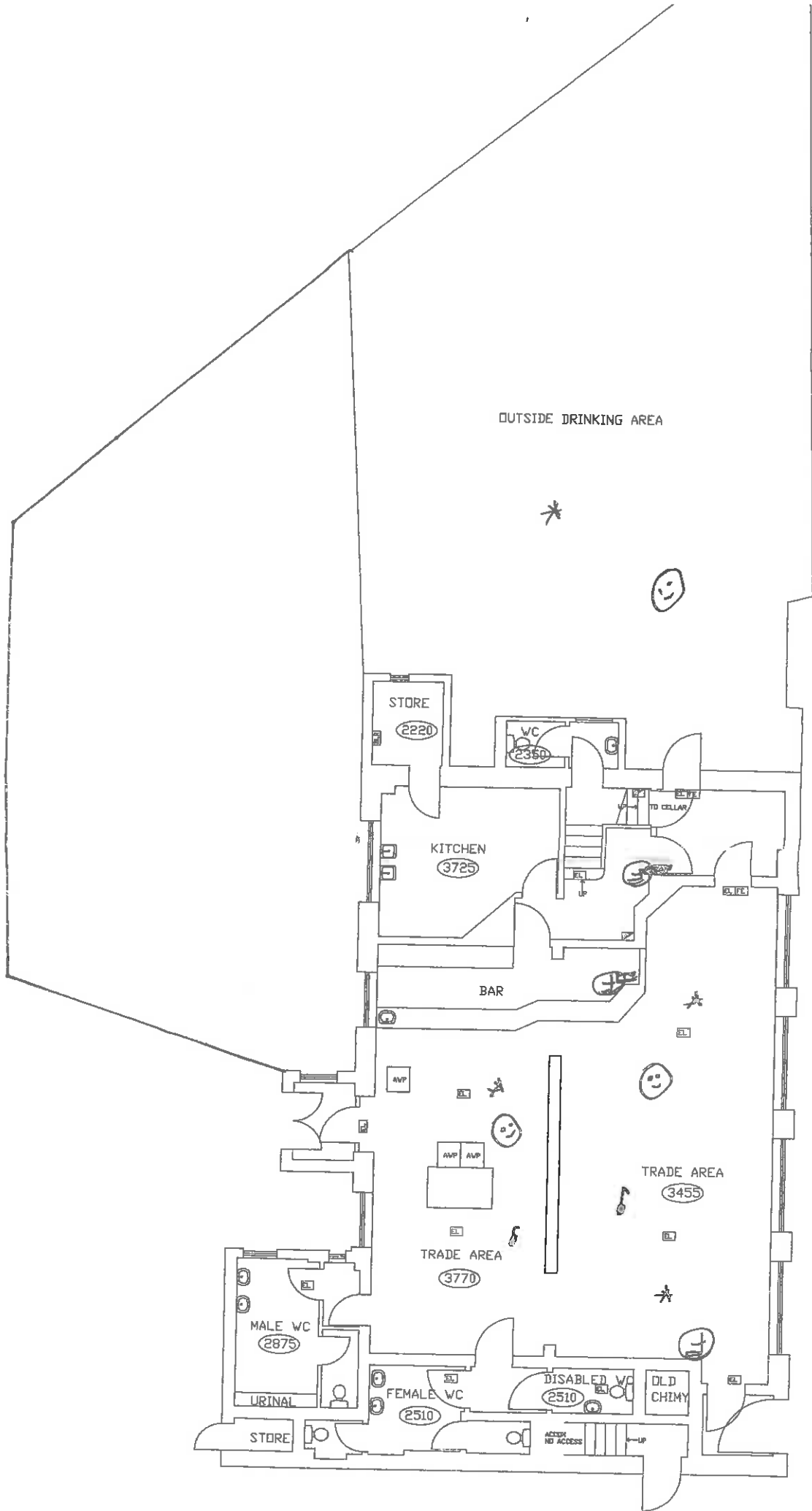
Further to the above specific conditions the following recommendations are made:

#### KEY ISSUES:

#### SECURITY

- 1.1 We have obtained written confirmation from Freedom Security that all outstanding issues **will** be rectified as of immediate effect (**please see document attached**)  
A new, **separate security plan of action** has been put into place by the company and **will** be monitored by our newly appointed Licensing and Safety Manager.
- 1.2 All security staff are to arrive **30 minutes before shift**, fully equipped and ready to be briefed on the evening ahead by our Licensing and Safety Manager.
- 1.3 A **written log** will be compiled each week in a spreadsheet format, consisting of each evening's events and any incidents which will correlate with CCTV to be sent over weekly.
- 1.4 Issues with entry will be combatted by our Licensing and Safety Manager, who will be **the sole key holder** to the rear entry; this will be closely monitored throughout the evening and logged within the **written report**.
- 1.5 Any person entering or re-entering the venue will need to **supply ID and will be fully searched without exception**; this will be overseen, documented and reviewed by our Licensing and Safety Manager.

The Licensing and Safety Manager, Sarah-Emma Hughes will be available for contact in case of emergency, by radio and also mobile telephone at all times. Please see attached a database for all management contact information.

#### NOISE LEVELS

- 2.1 Working with Environmental Health and local businesses, we are developing relationships and building confidence by **bridging** communications ourselves and implementing **locked and restricted sound equipment** which has noise and DB monitoring devices to correct any misuse of equipment and to minimise disruption to surrounding businesses.

The General Manager and Licensing Safety Manager will work to rebuild relationships with surrounding businesses and be a direct point of contact should any future noise issues occur.

#### EVENTS

- 3.1 Our Events Manager, Theodore Hoffman will supply all relevant information to Police Licensing well within the allocated **30 day requirement**. All management and operational staff are to be copied into any emails to ensure communication is delivered.
- 3.2 An **events plan** will be in place (and available for review if needed) for each event, with a list of DJ set times and staff duties compiled by our General Manager Manjit Bhella and Theodore Hoffman.

I am Police Sergeant of the West Midlands Police currently stationed at Wolverhampton Central

At about 0345 in the early hours of Thursday 1<sup>st</sup> January 2015 and with other officers, I attended the Prince Albert Public house to a report of a group of six to eight males trying to get into the premises. On arrival I spoke to one of the door staff who confirmed that they had just prevented a group of males from 'Rushing' the doors. During the night there had been a number of incidents at this location and I received information from Inspector Vickers that the DPS should consider closing the premises early.

I spoke to the DPS of the premises a person I now know to be Sarah HUGHES and informed her of our concerns and that she should consider closing the premises early. Ms HUGHES confirmed that the closing time for the premises was at 0500 hours and stated that all the issues were outside the premises. I was invited to conduct a walk through the premises with HUGHES and I would estimate that there were about 280 persons in the premises. There was in my opinion a tense atmosphere as I walked through with a number of patrons giving off a 'Macho' bravado upon seeing officers.

As we were near the exit there was a commotion at the entrance gates and I could see a doorman shutting the gate as a person was trying to get in. This person whom I would describe as a black male about 5'10" tall of muscular build was advised of his behaviour by other officers. I again explained to HUGHES that she should consider closing the venue for the night. She eventually agreed to do so but explained that it may take some time to clear so I agreed that she had 30 minutes to do so. Due to the increase in police requests, I was unable to return to the venue for the rest of my tour of duty.

They then continued to attempt to force entry to the venue, & again when refused starting trying to grab at members of my security team over the top of the gate. The group continued to be aggressive & due to lack of correspondence with ourselves & to eliminate any risk I instructed the DPS to notify to Police in assistance to move the group away from the premises. When the Police arrived the situation had calmed, & they continued to inspect the venue. On their way out, the group had arrived again & were again refusing to vacate so the Officers at site stepped in to contain the situation & move them away from the venue. **Despite the minimal issues inside the venue**, the Sergeant on Duty requested that DPS started to wind down the night & close by 4.30AM rather than the 5AM finishing time to just ensure the safety of patrons. This was adhered to & there were no further issues.

Apologies for the delay in this getting to you, I have no idea why Sarah's email hasn't reached you but it was sent on the 26/12/2015 I can send you confirmation of this in a second email if you require.

As discussed today I have now asked Sarah to hand over licensing responsibility to Kelly. Kelly is now based in the Prince Albert office and will be the point of contact for the venue going forward. I know you said you would be very happy for Kelly to be the point of contact for The Prince Albert as well as The Grain Store as her correspondence and efficiency is very good.

I understand there have been issues over the last 12 months in my absence and I can assure you that all these areas are being addressed. The venue is getting a full refurbishment and the management team is being strengthened as well as myself, Richard and Andrew having an active input into the management of the business.

If we could meet early next week to discuss The New Prince Albert that would be great as I would like to include everyone on the new management team, so we are all on the same page and happy with the new direction the business is now moving in.

DPS changeover:

Signage has now been put up on the front door explaining no hats will be allowed inside the venue at any time.

Anyone wearing hats will be refused entry unless they remove it or leave it in the cloakroom which is now inside the front door pay desk.

Search Mitts:

It has been agreed with licensing that a knife arch would not be necessary if vibrating metal detector search gloves are used.

I confirm that 2 pairs of search gloves are now in full operation on the venue door and all patrons will be fully searched on entry and re-entry to the venue, alongside the venues current stringent search policy.

CCTV:

The front door facial recognition camera has been replaced and is now working.



Any obstructions to CCTV have been removed.

**ID scanner:**

A mobile App ID scanner will be used to build a data base of customers, starting from the relaunch date, this date was suggested by the inspector at the meeting as it was pointless collecting data from customers currently as we would be changing the business model and attracting a new more friendly crowd once relaunched.

**Security:**

There has been an issue with obtaining incident reports from the venue head doorman resulting in a delay from Sarah in sending the reports to licensing and reflecting badly on the efficiency of the venue management.

The head doorman has been removed with immediate effect and a new head doorman has been selected who is a compliance manager for Freedom security and rated very highly.

I trust this action plan meets your requirements and I look forward to seeing you next week.

I write on behalf of the Licensing Authority as a responsible authority. I write in support of the above review application made by Chief Constable of West Midlands Police. Representations are made against the crime and disorder and public safety licensing objectives the failure of the current management of the premises to promote these licensing objectives.

The premises licence holder, Richard Ryan Ltd and the management of the premises have not demonstrated they are operating in accordance with their premises licence and therefore are not promoting the licensing objectives of crime and disorder and public safety.

The issues raised by the Police relate to serious assaults including wounding with a knife which resulted in hospitalisation and surgery, drugs and breaches of licence conditions. The Police have continually worked over a period of 12 months with and supported the premises licence holder in developing action plans in order to address these concerns. However, these have not been upheld. This shows a blatant disregard to the licensing objectives by the premises licence holder and the management of the premises.

If Councillors are satisfied that illegal activities have taken place at the premises and are in breach of promoting the licensing objectives, the Licensing Authority would request the Licensing Sub-Committee ensure these issues are addressed by considering modification of the current premises licence in accordance with Section 52 of The Licensing Act 2003 and guidance issued by the Secretary of State under 182 of the Act together with Wolverhampton City Council's Statement of Licensing Policy.

Continued....



Councillors may conclude from the evidence given within the review application and at the hearing in order to promote the licensing objectives it is necessary to revoke the licence due to the serious nature of the criminal activity at the premises.

The Licensing Authority fully supports the review application brought by the West Midlands Police and concludes the above issues should be resolved in order to promote the licensing objectives of crime and disorder and public safety.

## **EH COMPLAINT and LICENSING HISTORY for the Prince Albert**

**4th April 2012** Premises Licence variation of Premises DPS granted. PLH Richard Ryan Limited. DPS Tadhg McGillicuddy.

**25<sup>th</sup> September 2012** a guest at the Britannia hotel complained that could not sleep as there was extremely loud music coming from the Prince Albert pub between 22.00 and 02.10 hours. Discussed with Prince Albert. **(Appendix 1)**

**26<sup>th</sup> September 2012** a complaint was received that posters had been put up in the city centre advertising an event. Prince Albert was advised and posters were taken down. **(Appendix 2)**

**17<sup>th</sup> October 2012** a complaint was received that posters advertising Haunted Hotel Halloween event were found in phone box in Dudley Street. **(Appendix 3)**  
Warning letter sent. **(Appendix 4)**

**15<sup>th</sup> December 2012** loud music was reported from the Prince Albert. Complainant was called circa 01.40 a.m. Message left, no reply. **(Appendix 5)**

**30<sup>th</sup> June 2013** there was a complaint of loud music from the patio, beer garden area. Message left for complainant to call if having problems with loud music. **(Appendix 6)**

Also on **30<sup>th</sup> June 2013** there was another noise complaint from the Prince Albert which was holding a temporary event involving music outdoors. **(Appendix 7)**

**13<sup>th</sup> July 2013** very loud music from the Prince Albert was reported by the taxi drivers. Unable to contact complainant, phone kept disconnecting. **(Appendix 8)**

**2<sup>nd</sup> August 2013** the Prince Albert was visited by officers at 18.58. Noise levels were deemed to be acceptable. Advice was given. **(Appendix 9)**

**22nd/23rd September 2013** Noise monitoring was carried out by DMX Productions Ltd on behalf of Richard Ryan Limited during an event held at the premises. DMX concluded that all measurements taken confirmed that the noise from the premises was inaudible within neighbouring occupied properties.

**11th October 2013** Premises Licence Variation application to extend the current licence to the outside terrace and car park for the hours of Monday to Saturday 7pm to 4am.

**21st November 2013** Following a licencing sub-committee hearing this Premises Licence Variation was granted subject to a number of conditions agreed between Environmental Health (Commercial) and the Premises Licence Holder and which are set out in the Premises Licence dated **(Appendix 10)**

These conditions include the agreement that noise/vibration will not emanate from the premises to cause a nuisance at the closest sensitive property; compliance with the noise plan submitted on 21 November 2013 **(Appendix 11)**; noise monitoring patrols; closure of windows and doors during regulated entertainment; use of noise limiting equipment; and dealing with complaints promptly.

**2<sup>nd</sup> December 2013** Loud noise from late night outdoor event, 29<sup>th</sup> November. Complainant never heard anything like it and has lived at her property for 4 ½ years. Could not sleep. Numerous DJs across outdoor marquees. No complaints from Britannia hotel. Out of Hours telephone number given to complainant. **(Appendix 12)**

Regarding that same night on **2<sup>nd</sup> December 2013** complaint received that could hear the music clearly even though they have fully closed, double glazed windows, 12 week old baby and feels the volume is anti-social. Complainant advised. **(Appendix 13)**

**6<sup>th</sup> January 2014** Noise from local pub believed to be Prince Albert. Complainant and girlfriend cannot sleep. Noise at weekends and some week nights. Can carry on until 4am. Allegation unsubstantiated as unable to obtain further information from complainant. **(Appendix 14)**

**5<sup>th</sup> June 2014** Notification received to change the nominated Designated Premises Supervisor from Tadgh McGillicuddy to Manjit Singh Bhella.

**5<sup>th</sup> June 2014** Prince Albert had a club night until 2am. Complainant stressed, no sleep states that this has happened countless times. Officers unable to investigate due to lack of information and contact details from complainant. **(Appendix 15)**

**24<sup>th</sup> June 2014** Complainant with disabled mother were having a meal nearby on 21<sup>st</sup> June and asked for the music to be turned down and it was turned up. The manager of the restaurant contacted the Prince Albert 3 times on the Saturday regarding music from an outdoor event. A number of staff from the Grand Theatre also complained about the noise from this outdoor event which took place 14.00-18.00 but for which no TEN was received. Manager of restaurant given Out of Hours number. Officers arranged to visit manager Manjit of Prince Albert to discuss issues. **(Appendix 16)**

**27<sup>th</sup> June 2014** Objection by Environmental Health (Commercial) to a late Temporary Event Notice (5<sup>th</sup>-6<sup>th</sup> July) **(Appendix 17)**

The aforementioned noise complaints and failure to apply for a TEN for the 21<sup>st</sup> June regulated event (which is a direct breach of the Licencing Act 2003) were among the reasons this late TEN was objected to.

**7<sup>th</sup> August 2014** Helium/Nitrous Oxide balloons being sold on premises. Health and Safety concerns as customers encouraged to inhale. Prince Albert advised by Police that Wolverhampton has zero tolerance on this. Owner Ryan McGillicuddy unaware of balloons being sold. Owner also confirmed that the manager Manjit was sacked on 5<sup>th</sup> August and a new manager Sarah had been appointed. **(Appendix 18)**

**7<sup>th</sup> August 2014** Notification received to change the nominated Designated Premises Supervisor from Manjit Singh Bhella to Tadgh McGillicuddy.

**12<sup>th</sup> September 2014** Fly posting of forthcoming 'Funkshun' event around the city. The manager was advised. A warning letter was sent to Richard Ryan Limited. **(Appendix 19)**

**24<sup>th</sup> November 2014** Loud low frequency noise audible at 1am, woke up son. Officers visited the following weekend on 29<sup>th</sup>. Noise barely heard but low level frequency detected in the street. At another location, Westfield Road, music clearly audible. The same beat was also

heard by an officer from the rear of Bilston College. Advice provided. On 1<sup>st</sup> December the complainant said noise terrible until 1am. Noise monitoring equipment installed. Nothing heard on the following 2 weekends. **(Appendix 20)**

**2<sup>nd</sup> February 2015** Loud music from speakers outside venue. Complainant staying at the Britannia hotel and said noise was insane at 1am. Spoke to doorman who said venue licenced to play music until 3am. Tried calling the venue, no reply. On 4<sup>th</sup> Feb messages were left with the venue, The Britannia and the complainant none of which were returned. **(Appendix 21)**

**6<sup>th</sup> February 2015** Loud music every weekend causing disturbance. Complainant sent log sheets in event of further problems. However premises currently closed for a refurbishment. Officer spoke to owner Ryan who had distanced himself from the venue but due to problems would take a more active role. Outside area not to be used for loud music after refurb. Issues explained to Ryan and lack of response from the venue. He is looking to rebuild relationship with the Council. A noise action plan is to be developed and sent for approval. **(Appendix 22)**. The noise plan from November 2013 was put back into place **(Appendix 11)**.

**9th February 2015** Notification received to change the nominated Designated Premises Supervisor from Tadhg McGillicuddy to Sarah Emma Hughes.

**23<sup>rd</sup> May 2015** Fly posting. A3 posters stuck on all traffic signals around ring road. Manager unaware of this. Advised that offence to fly post and that FPNs can be served. Manager stated that using a new promoter and posters to be removed asap. **(Appendix 23)**

**13<sup>th</sup> July 2015** Unspecified noise from premises. Complainant moved into flat on Wednesday and on Friday the noise was so loud that the flat was shaking. Unable to sleep even with ear plugs and ended up driving to Morecambe overnight to stay with relatives. The complainant has ended his rental contract early. Complainant advised that EH is aware of noise and is working with the business to rectify the issues. **(Appendix 24)**

- 2) Plastic or polycarbonate glasses only to be used for the consumption of beverages whilst in any of the outside areas. No glasses or glass bottles/containers to be permitted under any circumstances in this area, either by staff or customers.
- 3) The premises will be equipped with an ID Scanner which will be utilised as part of the entry requirements for patrons. All patrons to be scanned on first visit. Any patrons refusing to have ID scanned will not be permitted into the venue. Any information stored within the ID Scanner must be made available to any member of a Responsible Authority upon request, or least within 12 hours of request.
- 4) Door supervisors deployed in the Arena area must wear high visibility attire consisting of at least a fluorescent tabard/jacket so that they are easily identified as security staff. Overt wearing of SIA certificates only is not sufficient.
- 5) The capacity level of the Arena area must not exceed the number detailed within the risk assessment for each specific event. Door supervisors deployed in this section must operate clickers to ensure that this level is not exceeded.
- 6) All patrons entering the Arena area will be subject of a search by door supervisors. Any person refusing to be searched will not be permitted in the Arena area.
- 7) The outside area must be covered by CCTV with the following stipulation:
  - CCTV should cover entry and exit points of the Arena area and all areas where alcohol/money is served/taken and all areas to where public have access and the immediate vicinity outside the premise.
  - Images / recordings to be downloaded in a suitable format and provided to any member of a Responsible Authority upon request and without any undue delay.
  - Images and recordings must be of evidential quality, must indicate the correct time and date and be kept for at least 31 days.
  - All staff to be trained to use the CCTV system and at least one member of staff to be on duty who is trained to download the systems images should any member of a Responsible Authority make a request.

Conditions agreed between Environmental Health (Commercial) and the Premises Licence Holder

The following conditions will only apply to the outside part of the venue, to be called 'The Arena':

- 1) Noise/vibration will not emanate from the premises to cause at nuisance at the closest sensitive property.
- 2) Compliance with the noise plan submitted on 21 November 2013 will be set as conditions of your operating schedule.
- 3) All doors and windows in the Prince Albert building must remain closed when regulated entertainment takes place, except to allow for access and egress.
- 4) No licensable activity will take place outdoors on a Monday to Thursday except on all Bank Holidays (including bank Holiday Mondays), Valentine's Day, Easter Monday, Halloween, Bonfire night, Christmas Eve, Christmas Day, New Year's Eve, New Year's Day.
- 5) All recorded and Live music will be reduced after 0100 hours. Sound limiter equipment must be used on all sound producing equipment used at all events to ensure noise and



vibration from the licensable activities does not cause a nuisance at the closest sensitivity properties.

- 6) All recorded and live music in the outside area will terminate at 0200 hours with the exception of any background entertainment and a maximum of two outdoor events in the arena area per calendar month.
- 7) Regular patrols, by a responsible person, will be undertaken of the surrounding area of the external area of the premises to ensure that the entertainment at the premises or noise from patrons outside the premises is at a level not to cause a nuisance to residents living in the vicinity of the premises. Patrols will be undertaken at least twice each day/night regulated entertainment takes place.
- 8) Should the DPS or Premises licence holder be notified of any justified noise complaints action must be taken immediately to reduce the level of music and or vibration to the satisfaction of the investigating Officer.
- 9) The surface of the lower arena area will be resurfaced prior to are being used, so as to provide a sound, safe, even surface for patrons

Further to the above specific conditions the following recommendations are made:

The same sound producing system is used to provide all regulated entertainment.

Speakers in the arena area are directed towards the Prince Albert building to reduce noise and vibration levels emanating from events.

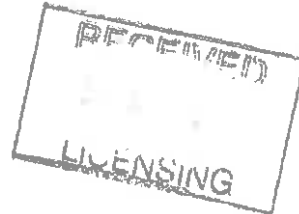

## **Noise Plan**



### **Introduction**

The Prince Albert has been working closely with Environmental Health, local residents and businesses over the past 6 months producing the perfect sound levels to avoid being a nuisance to the surrounding businesses and residents. We believe that we have the perfect management system, which controls sound levels to avert creating a disturbance.

### **General Weekend Nights**

At weekends we would like to have Dj's on the terrace playing smooth terrace style background music at a low level. Between the hours of 11pm and 4am noise levels will be gradually reduced from 65DB to 55DB by our professional sound engineers (55Db is below general conversation level). Between the hours of 2am and 4am mellow music will be played to further reduce noise levels (N.B when events are held in the events arena no music is played on the terrace).

### Events In The Arena (Car Park)

The car park has been transformed in to an events arena where live bands, acts and DJs can perform with a festival feel. This addition to the business has been a huge success over the last six months and all events in the new area have been held under temporary event notices.

Between the hours of 11pm and 4am noise levels will be gradually reduced from 95DB down to 65DB. Between the hours of 2am and 4am mellow music will be played to further reduce noise levels. (N.B when events are held in the events arena no music is played on the terrace).

### Sound Equipment

For all outdoor music events, specialist sound equipment is hired with digital amplifiers which are locked away in a management office, only accessed with a secure code by our professional sound engineers.

All sound systems are carefully positioned so that sound travel is reduced. A large perimeter wall, which contains a large percentage of the sound, surrounds the Prince Albert; outside of the perimeter wall sound level is greatly reduced.

### Monitoring

Specialist sound monitoring equipment is hired and monitored continuously throughout each event from the management office to ensure all noise plan levels are maintained.

Before and during the event, sound levels are checked by sending an engineer to stand with a sound monitoring device at the nearest businesses and local residential properties. This device then sends sound level readings back to the equipment in the management office to be checked by engineers, again this insures that noise plan levels are maintained.

Any noise levels reading above the planned noise levels during an event are immediately turned down by sound engineers in the office.

### **Sound Engineers**

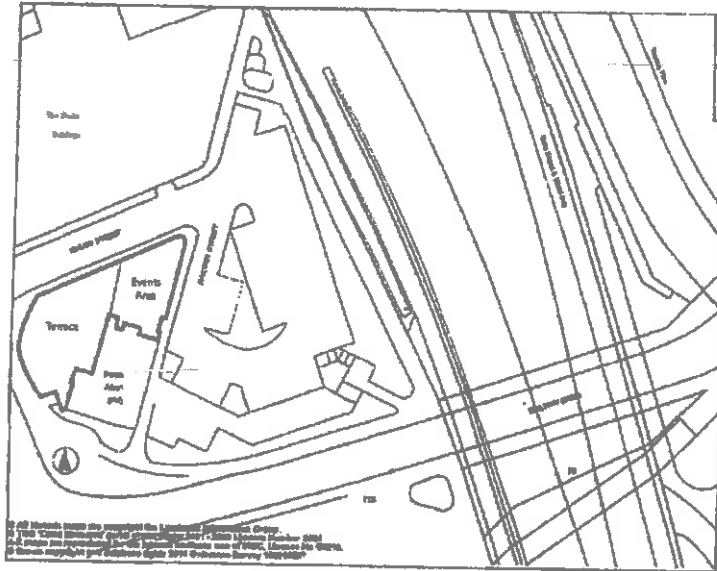
We employ 2 full time sound engineers for the sole purpose of monitoring outdoor music to maintain sound levels as per venue noise plan.

### **Sound Checks**

Prior to doors opening at any Prince Albert event all sound monitoring equipment is tested and calibrated to ensure full working order. Amplifier levels are set and noise recordings from inside the events area, terrace, just outside the venue perimeter and the nearest businesses and residential properties are read to ensure all levels are correct as per noise plan.

### **Conclusion**

After the success of the Events Arena over the last 6 months it has become apparent just how important a part the new area plays in bringing international bands and artists to The Prince Albert. It is vital to the business that acceptable noise levels are continually maintained by noise engineers in line with the noise level plan to ensure that any outdoor music licenses are not revoked should they be granted. In turn this will allow The Prince Albert to grow and continue bringing new music the City of Wolverhampton.
