1.0 Purpose of Report

1.1 To submit for consideration by the Sub-Committee an application for a variation of a premises licence.

2.0 Background

- 2.1 An application has been received from Licensing Solutions, the agent of the holder of the premises licence, in respect of Compton filling Station, Bridgnorth Road. Wolverhampton. WV6 8AQ. A copy of the application is attached at Appendix 1.
- 2.2 It is the understanding of the licensing authority, that the application to vary this premises licence has been properly made. The statutory requirement to give notice of the application has also been complied with. The premises are located in the Tettenhall Wightwick ward and a location plan is attached at Appendix 2
- 2.3 The current application was received on 14 September 2015 and is to add hours to the licensable activities, in addition to adding late night refreshment. An additional separate application has been received to change the name of the premises to Compton Filling Station.
- 2.4 A copy of the current licence is attached at Appendix 3.
- 2.5 The following responsible authorities have been consulted on this application:

2.7 The applicant, and all of those who have made representations, has been invited to attend the hearing.

3.0 Legal Implications

- 3.1 Section 4(1) of the Licensing Act 2003 states that a Licensing Authority must carry out its function under the Act with a view to promoting the licensing objectives namely:
 - (a) The prevention of crime and disorder;
 - (b) Public safety;
 - (c) The prevention of public nuisance;
 - (d) The protection of children from harm.
- 3.2 The general duties imposed on Licensing Authorities means proper consideration must be given to the licensing objectives when determining a premises licence variation application.
 - Section 35 of the Licensing Act 2003 provides the Licensing Authority with the power to vary a licence, subject to conditions, where appropriate.
- 3.3 In addition, regard shall be had to guidance issued by the Secretary of State under Section 182 of the Licensing Act 2003 and Wolverhampton City Council's Licensing Policy Statement. [SH/23102015/L]

4.0 Human Rights and Equalities Implications

- 4.1 This report has human rights implications for both the premises licence holder and the residents from the local neighbourhood. Any of the steps outlined in Section 4 of this report may have financial implications for a licensee's business and livelihood and/or may have impact upon the day to day lives of residents living in close proximity to the premises.
- 4.2 Article 8(i) of the European Convention of Human Rights provides that everyone has the right to respect for his/her private and family life and his/her home (which includes business premises). This right may be interfered with by the Council on a number of grounds including the protection of rights and freedoms of others. The First Protocol Article 1 also provides that every person is entitled to the peaceful enjoyment of his possessions and shall not be deprived of his possessions except in the public interest and conditions provided for by law. Members must accordingly make a decision which is proportionate to the hearing and endeavour to find a balance between the rights of the applicant, residents and the community as a whole.

5.0 Financial Implications

5.1 Councillors agreed fees and charges for this function on 21 January 2015; the fees are based on a cost recovery basis. The fee for this application is £190.00, and is non-refundable. [TK/09012015/H]



We have a strong objection to this application on the grounds of

- the prevention of public nuisance
- maintaining public health and safety
- the prevention of crime and disorder
- the protection of children from harm.





Our reasons are below:

- We regularly have to put up with nuisance events during the current opening hours, all of which would have far more impact through the night. The current closing times ostensibly afford us a potentially peaceful 8 hours of sleep which would be regularly disrupted if the petrol station were open throughout the night. The disturbances we experience during the day, evening and in some cases in the night include such things as:
 - Car doors slamming
 - Use of the tannoy, sometimes for the operatives' personal amusement
 - Shouting and quarrelling, sometimes involving bad language and obscenities
 - Loud music/drumbeats from cars where the owner has not turned off their radio/player while at the petrol station, which at their most extreme actually vibrate through the house
 - Lights on for the pumps, prices board, shop area and car-wash in fact all lights throughout the night
 - Litter, including bottles, just dropped or occasionally thrown over the low wall along our path and drive and causing an unpleasant hazard, or thrown onto the pavement
 - Men urinating in the corner of the forecourt right underneath our bedroom window and in full view of the road
 - Enthusiast groups, eg motor cyclists, scooter owners, cyclists, 'iron man' participants, use the petrol station as a gathering place. These people have little

- thought for the neighbours of the petrol station and leave engines running/revving noisily while having their snacks and waiting for comrades
- Excessive 'macho' raucous acceleration, particularly of sports cars and motorbikes when leaving the garage.
- Over the years we have asked repeatedly for the price display board and car-wash to be turned off during hours of closure, on grounds of energy conservation and limiting light pollution, as well as for our own peace of mind. Occasionally in the night a motorist will think the petrol station is open, as the lights are on. They wake us up by opening and closing car doors, sounding their horn or shouting for attention and driving off loudly.
- 3. The petrol station has minimal passing traffic at night, either cars or particularly pedestrian callers, as there is no-one walking past into the countryside after about 8-9 o'clock; it becomes a very quiet country road until about 7 am.
- 4. Anyone wishing to buy alcohol in the night would have to arrive in a vehicle, possibly in order to replenish party stocks or to continue drinking after public houses/clubs are closed; would such customers have already consumed alcohol and therefore would they be driving legally and safely?

For the reasons listed above we therefore request that the license extension be refused.

I list the current anti-social behaviour we suffer from the petrol station and shop. There is every reason to believe that this behaviour will continue throughout the night should the license be granted.

- Men urinating against the wall of the shop in full view of my garden, passing motorists and pedestrians
- Groups of youths using the steps to our garden and the lower part of the lawn to drink and eat. (We have had to erect a large gate to prevent this). Groups of youths sitting on our neighbours steps to eat and drink.
- Loud music from car stereos including when parked to consume goods purchased at the shop
- Inappropriate use of the public address system for the amusement of staff
- Bottles being thrown from car windows, pushed into the hedgerows and broken on the pavement. Also cans and food wrappers. This pavement is on the way to a children's playground.
- Bags of rubbish dropped on ours and others driveways containing bottles, cans and food wrappings
- Groups of motor scooter enthusiasts meeting and keeping motors running
- Groups of motor cyclists keeping engines running while drinking and eating and holding loud conversations over the engine noise.
- Prolonged sounding of horns
- Loud arguments on the forecourt including the use of bad language.

My further observations are:

That although the food is take-away, many motor cyclists and motorists stay on the forecourt to consume the goods.

The evidence from discarded bottles and cans is that alcohol is being drunk while on the road rather than being taken home for responsible consumption.





- 2.2 The premises are in St Peters ward and a location plan is attached at Appendix 2.
- 2.3 The application is in respect of regulated entertainment, and the sale/supply of alcohol on the premises, and late night refreshment; the precise detail of what has been applied for can be found within the operating schedule of the application of the application.
- 2.6 The House of India is situated within the Cumulative Impact Zone. A copy of the policy and area which it covers is attached at Appendix 3.
- 2.7 The following responsible authorities have been consulted on this application:
 - Licensing Authority
 - West Midlands Fire Service
 - Planning
 - Trading Standards
 - Social Services
 - Local Health Board
 - Environmental Health (Commercial)
 - West Midlands Police
- 2.8 The following have all made relevant representations and are objecting to the grant of this application citing the Cumulative Impact Policy and the licensing objectives:
 - West Midlands Police
 - Licensing Authority
 - West Midlands Fire Service

Copies of their representations are attached at Appendices 4 - 6

2.9 The applicant, and all those who have made representations have been invited to attend the hearing.

3.0 **Policy Implications**

3.1 On 3 April 2015 the Statement of Licensing Policy was revised to give effect to the Cumulative Impact Policy (CIP) in four new areas of the City. This decision supported the view that the number, type and density of premises selling alcohol for consumption and/or Late Night Refreshment in areas within Wolverhampton City was causing problems of nuisance and disorder and therefore causing an adverse impact on the

licensing objectives of prevention of crime and disorder and prevention of public nuisance.

- 3.2 The effect of this CIP is to create a **rebuttable** presumption that applications in respect of the sale or supply of alcohol and/or Late Night Refreshment for new Premises Licences, Club Premises Certificates or Provisional Statements and applications for variations of existing Premises Licences, Club Premises Certificates where the premises are situated in the City Centre Cumulative Impact Zone will be refused.
- 3.3 Essentially this means that applications that are likely to add to the existing cumulative impact will normally be refused, unless the applicant can demonstrate in their operating schedule that there will be no negative cumulative impact on one or more of the licensing objectives. (This policy does not act as an absolute prohibition on granting new licences in the Cumulative Impact Zones).
- 3.4 The premises are situated at 25 Market Street, Wolverhampton WV1 3AG, which is within the City Centre Cumulative Impact Zone.
- 3.5 To rebut the presumption, explained in 3.3 above, the applicant is expected to demonstrate through their operating schedule and where appropriate with supporting evidence that the operation of the premises will not add to the cumulative impact already being experienced and not therefore have an adverse impact in the Licensing Objectives.

4.0 Legal implications

- 4.1 Part 4(1) of the Licensing Act 2003 states that a Licensing Authority must carry out its function under the Act with a view to promoting the Licensing Objectives, namely:-
 - (a) The prevention of crime and disorder;
 - (b) Public safety;
 - (c) The prevention of public nuisance;
 - (d) The protection of children from harm.
- 4.2 The general duties imposed on Licensing Authorities means proper consideration must be given to the Licensing Objectives when determining a premises licence application.
- 4.3 Regard shall be had to guidance issued by the Secretary of State under Section 182 and Wolverhampton City Council's Licensing Policy Statement which includes a Cumulative Impact Policy.
- 4.4 Section 18 of the Licensing Act 2003 provides the Licensing Authority with the power to grant an application, subject to conditions, where appropriate
- 4.5 In order for the Cumulative Impact Policy to be relevant to this application the Sub-Committee

- I. Should be satisfied it applies due to:
 - (a) Premises being located within the Cumulative Impact Zone;
 - (b) Licensable activity applied for at the premises is to include sale of alcohol or late night refreshment and is;
 - (c) The likelihood that the activity will have an impact on the crime and disorder or prevention of public nuisance licensing objectives.

And where the Cumulative Impact Policy is deemed to apply:

- II. Should refuse an application based upon the Cumulative Impact Policy unless sufficient evidence is produced, by the applicant, to rebut the presumption that a licence will not be granted or varied.
- 4.6 If the Sub-Committee are satisfied sufficient evidence has been produced to show the premises will not add to the Cumulative Impact already being experienced, the application should not be refused based upon Cumulative Impact Policy. [SH/17092015/W]
- 5.0 Human Rights and Equalities Implications
- 5.1 This report has human rights implications for both the applicants and the residents from the local neighbourhood. Refusal of a licence may have financial implications for a licensee's business and livelihood whereas granting a licence may have impact upon the day to day lives of residents living in close proximity to the premises.
- 5.2 Article 8(i) of the European Convention of Human Rights provides that everyone has the right to respect for his/her private and family life and his/her home (which includes business premises). This right may be interfered with by the Council on a number of grounds including the protection of rights and freedoms of others. The First Protocol Article 1 also provides that every person is entitled to the peaceful enjoyment of his possessions and shall not be deprived of his possessions except in the public interest and conditions provided for by law. Members must accordingly make a decision which is proportionate to the hearing and endeavour to find a balance between the rights of the applicant, residents and the community as a whole.
- 5.3 The Public Sector Duty of the Equality Act 2010 also requires the Council to pay due regards (i.e. eliminate discrimination, harassment and victimisation; advance equality of opportunity and foster good relations), in any decisions it undertakes
- 6.0 Financial Implications
- 6.1 Councillors agreed fees and charges for this function on 21 January 2015; the fees are based on a cost recovery basis. The fee for this application is £190.00, and is non-refundable. [TK/09012015/H]



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CUMULATIVE IMPACT POLICY

It is not proposed to set quotas for particular types of licences. Applications will be considered on their individual merit thus ensuring that the characteristics of the many different types of licensed activity are fully considered. If crime and disorder or general disturbance/nuisance does prove to be linked to the concentration of customers of licensed premises or activities in these or any other particular areas, then it may be necessary to seek controls over the issue of new licences through a 'Cumulative Impact Policy'.

It would first be necessary to establish that, because of the number and density of licensed premises in a particular area, there are exceptional problems of nuisance, disturbance and/or disorder outside or away from those licensed premises as a result of their combined effect. Where particular premises are identifiable as being responsible for the problems, action will be taken against them.

Before deciding whether to adopt a Cumulative Impact Policy, the Council must be sure that the imposition of individual conditions to particular premises would not solve the problem. The Council has a duty under Section 17 of the Crime and Disorder Act 1998 to do all that it reasonably can to prevent crime and disorder.

In the Guidance issued under the Act there are four steps specified to be followed in considering whether to adopt a Cumulative Impact Policy:

- Identification of serious and chronic concern from a responsible Authority or representatives of residents about nuisance or disorder.
- Assessment of causes.
- Where it can be demonstrated that disorder and nuisance is arising as a result of customers of licensed premises, identifying the area from which problems are arising and the boundaries of that area.
- Adopting a policy about future licence applications from that area.

The Licensing Committee will keep any Cumulative Impact Policy under review and modify or remove it, as considered appropriate.

As detailed above the Council recognises that because of the number of and density of licensed premises selling alcohol and/or Late Night Refreshment in particular areas there might be exceptional problems of nuisance, disturbance and/or disorder outside or away from those licensed premises as a result of their combined effect. In these cases it may be necessary to seek controls over the issue of new licences through a 'Cumulative Impact Policy'.

The Licensing Authority is now of the view that in these areas this is causing cumulative impact and designates these areas as Cumulative Impact Zones. The details of the policy specific to each area are described below.

The effect of the Cumulative Impact Policy is to create a **rebuttable** presumption that applications in respect the licensable activities detailed below for new Premises Licences, Club Premises Certificates or Provisional Statements and applications for variations of existing Premises Licences, Club Premises Certificates (where the modifications are relevant to the issue of cumulative impact for example increases in hours or capacity) where the premises are situated in one of the Cumulative Impact Zones will be refused.

To rebut this presumption the applicant would be expected to show through the operating schedule and where appropriate with supporting evidence that the operation of the premises will not add to the cumulative impact already being experienced. This policy does not act as an absolute prohibition on granting new licences in the Cumulative Impact Zones.

The Cumulative Impact Policy will not be used to revoke an existing licence or certificate and will not be applicable to the review of existing licences.

I refer to the application for a premises licence made in respect of the above premises.

The relevant areas of the premises have been inspected and I have to inform you that the fire precautions relating to the application are insufficient to adequately promote the licensing objective "Public Safety".

The Fire Authority hereby makes representation to the **grant** in this instance due to the reasons detailed below:

The second floor has only one emergency escape route and the travel distance from the furthest point on the second floor to the final exit on the ground floor is approx 25 metres. The maximum allowance for this type of normal risk for only one exit route is 18 metres.

The frontage of the second floor had a section of normal glass framed windows to let in light and is a viewing point to the outside. This is set back overlooking the front area of the first floor, the window set was not of the same fire resisting quality as the wall and would therefore not stand up to the same amount of heat and smoke resistance as the rest of the building.

The main stairway is of wooden construction to both floors, although the underside of the stairway was not inspected at the time of the visit, it must be emphasized that the stairway must be under drawn with suitable fire resisting material.

The representation will not be withdrawn until this Authority is satisfied that the fire precautions relating to the application are of such a standard to adequately promote the Public Safety licensing objective. Should any required works be completed prior to the date of any hearing, the applicant must inform the Fire Authority at least 5 days before that hearing in order for an inspection to be carried out to determine if the representation can be withdrawn.
