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Hi,

West Midlands Police wish to make representations under the 2 Licensing Objectives; Prevention of Crime and Disorder and Public Safety.

The operating schedule in this application, albeit lengthy is not fit for purpose and not enforceable.

The floor plan in this application is different to the floor plan in the original planning application that was granted in 2019. Has the intended use changed?

In this application Clive Thomason has failed to document anywhere the intended use of the function rooms and what activity will take place in them. There are concerns around whether the current licence application is suitable for its real and intended purpose/use.

This also raises concerns around all aspects of safety for persons within these rooms, which have not been addressed in this application.

We also have concerns around the locked door mechanism that is referred to and whether this would be a safety hazard in the event of an emergency. This may well be covered by the fire safety, but this has not been disclosed as yet.
