Police are defined as a 'Responsible Authority' under the Licensing Act 2003 and as such have statutory obligation to ensure that licensed premises comply with the requirements of the Act and the operating schedule relating to that premise.

The establishment known as Pepe's Piri-Piri is a late night refreshment establishment providing hot food and a delivery service of the same. It is situated on Broad Street, Wolverhampton in an area of both residential and takeaway properties. The hours of trading are Sunday to Wednesday 11.00-02.00, Thursday to Saturday 11.00-04.00. No Alcohol sales are made from the premises.

There are two names listed upon the licence as Premise Licence Holders, (PLH) Mr Abdul Aziz and Mr Yaseer Hussain. The building is owned by Landlady Mrs J Gofur and Mr N. Syed.

The application is made by West Midland's Police in relation to the following information relating to matters of serious crime;

A complaint has been received by Police in which it is alleged, males who are employees at the premises have been involved in the sexual exploitation of children. These acts of exploitation have been committed at the Pepe' Piri-Piri premises as well as in the takeaways' delivery vehicles and a further location. The children involved have been safeguarded at this time but it is not known if there are further victims which need to be identified.

Police Officer arrested two males employed at the premises at approximately 14.00 hours on Monday 24th August 2014. One male was arrested from the premises.

West Midlands Police are gravely concerned that due to the serious nature of the recent incidents and the yet to be determined knowledge of the incidents by both premises licence holders. There is a likely hood that there could be further serious incidents of crime at this venue.

Reassurances have been provided by the Landlord /Landlady of the premises who lease the premises to 'Pepe's Piri Piri that measures which will seek to promote the licensing objectives at the venue will be supported by him/her.
However, these are unenforceable and as they are not actively involved in the takeaway business this cannot be a realistic safe guard in the opinion of Police.

West Midlands Police are in support of local and independent businesses such as the Pepe's Piri Piri , however we cannot support this venue when there is a severe risk to public safety, harm to children and crime being conducted by staff at the premises.
