Conditions consistent with the Operating Schedule

Historic Permissions consistent with the Justices Licence as converted under the Licensing Act 2003

Provision of substantial refreshment

Hot food or hot drinks may be provided in line with alcohol sales with an additional thirty minutes thereafter.

Recorded Music

- The playing of recorded music in the premises is permitted 24 hours a day pursuant to Section 182 of the Licensing Act 1964.

Private Entertainment

- The provision of private entertainment for private gain is permitted 24 hours a day pursuant to Section 2 (2)(b) of the Private Places of Entertainment (Licensing Act) 1967.

Sale of Alcohol to residents

These premises are entitled to sell alcohol to residents and supply their bona fide guests 24 hours a day pursuant to section 63(2) LA 1964.

New Years Eve

The Regulatory Reform (Special Occasions Licensing) Order 2002.

- Where this licence does not otherwise permit, on New Years Eve these hours may be extended from the end of licensed hours on New Years Eve to the start of licensed hours on New Years Day.

Conditions consistent with Public Entertainment Licence

- All conditions that are specified on or consistent with the Public Entertainment Licence granted on 10 June 2005 under the Local Government Act 1982 will apply

General

I have undertaken my own risk assessment to take the following proposed steps:

- The types of regulated entertainment proposed materially do no more than reinstate the normal pub entertainment that was previously unregulated;
- No new steps have been identified in relation to the four licensing objectives save as below.
- The changes will improve supervision of the premises and will upgrade the fixtures and fittings.

The prevention of crime and disorder

No further risks have been identified which need to be addressed, save as below,

- Any person exercising a security activity (as defined by paragraph 2(1)(a) of schedule 2 of the Private Security Industry Act 2001) shall be licensed by the Security Industry Authority
- Such a person will be employed at the premises at the discretion of the designated premises supervisor/holder of the premises licence
- Any person as defined in condition (1) will clearly display his name badge at all times whilst on duty
- No customers apparently carrying open bottles upon entry shall be admitted to the premises at any times the premises are open to the public
- Where CCTV is installed with recording facilities such recordings shall be retained for a period of 30 days and made available within a reasonable time upon request by the police
- Alcoholic and other drinks may not be removed from the premises in open containers save for consumption in any external area provided for that purpose
- The maximum occupancy of the building (including staff and performers) will be restricted to 60 persons
- The potential risk of crime and disorder is reduced by these works, a lobby area is removed improving supervision, a separate food preparation area is created to provide food to customers.
- The construction of a stage in the lounge bar provides better division between entertainers and the public and conveys a more professional entertainment environment. Furthermore a CCTV system is to be installed.

Public safety

No further risks have been identified which need to be addressed, save as below,

- To comply with the reasonable requirements of the fire officer from time to time
- To comply with the reasonable requirements of the building control officer
- The potential risk of public safety is reduced by these works, the egress from the building is improved and there will be an upgrade to the quality of fixtures and fittings and decoration.

The prevention of public nuisance

No further risks have been identified which need to be addressed, save as below,

- Where appropriate, prominent, clear and legible notices shall be displayed at all exits requesting the public respect the needs of local residents and to leave the premises and area quietly
- Noise or vibration shall not emanate from the premises so as to cause a nuisance to nearby properties
- Existing PEL conditions to be retained and to cover extended hours as requested

The protection of children from harm

- The restrictions set out in the Licensing Act 2003 will apply. No unusual or additional risk of harm to children have been identified.
- No films or videos of any description will be shown so that they can be viewed by persons under the age of any applicable BBFC/Local Authority certification
- Children under the age of 16 shall not be permitted to enter the premises after 2100hrs
