Thank you for forwarding the representations, by way of background this application is part of a programme of approx. 400 being submitted nationwide where the current premises licences start at 08:00.

This motivation for the application is simply to achieve an operational flexibility moving forward and permit the store to open earlier on occasions as it has over the last 12 months particularly at Christmas and to achieve social distancing. However we are keen to avoid the need for future TEN applications.

There is no current intention to permanently change the trading pattern of the store but we appreciate the concerns raised by the Interested Parties and would therefore wish to suggest the following compromise to the application:

Amend from 06:00 – 00:00 to 07:00 – 23:00.

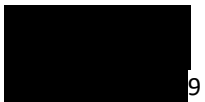
As the current terminal hour on the licence is 23:00 the application would be limited to 07:00 – 08:00 only.
