The proposed variation falls into 2 parts as follows:

1. To increase the outdoor licensed area to include a block paving area on a section of the slip road controlled by the premises, as detailed on the plan attached to this application.

For completeness, the plan attached to this application is to include the entrance way and terraced area, which is currently licensed dating back to 24th April 2007, as most recently confirmed by the Licensing Authority on the 3rd September 2021. The plan attached to this application is plan number 1513_16, which shows the proposed external area edged in red. For the avoidance of doubt, this application does not intend to alter the existing internal licensed area, which remain as currently licensed.

As the application is to increase the licensed area of the premises only, there is no increase in the operating hours of any licensable activity and therefore Part 4 has not been completed.

2. The Applicant also seeks to remove the following conditions from the Premises Licence as they are outdated and/or superseded by relevant legislation. The relevant conditions to be removed are as follows;

Public Safety

"All building works comply with current Building Regulations".

"Confirmation must be provided that both the fire alarm and emergency lighting systems comply with current British Standards"

"The Fire Authority must be advised of all charges (SIC) to the approved plan (plan at application) which may take place during construction"

"The premises will not open to public or guests until such time the Fire Authority are satisfied that all issues affecting Public Safety have been addressed"

Protection of Children from Harm

"The restrictions set out in the Licensing Act 2003 will apply."

b) The prevention of crime and disorder

An electronic or written incidents log will be maintained at the premises with a record of all incidents of crime and disorder reported to or by the premises; all ejections of patrons; any complaints received; seizures of drugs, offensive weapons, fraudulent ID or other items; any faults in the CCTV system; any visit by a relevant authority or emergency service. The incidents log will be produced to an officer of a responsible authority upon request. Where a crime is believed to have been committed, the incident will be reported to the West Midlands Police. The incidents log will be kept for at least 12 months and will be produced to an officer of a responsible authority upon request.

c) Public safety

The designated premises supervisor shall ensure that tables are cleared of all bottles and glasses on a regular basis during trading hours to avoid an accumulation of glassware.

The premises licence holder shall ensure that at all times when the public are present there is at least one competent and fully trained person able to administer first aid, that an adequate and appropriate supply of first aid equipment and materials is available on the premises, and that adequate records are maintained in relation to the supply of any first aid treatment.

d) The prevention of public nuisance

e) The protection of children from harm

The premises shall operate a proof of age scheme and will require photographic identification from any person who appears to be under the age of 18 years. (The below conditions is an extension to this already existing condition regarding age verification)

Proof of age will only comprise a passport, photo card driving licence, an EU/EEA national ID card or a card bearing the PASS hologram. When age-restricted goods are delivered to a customer's hotel room, the person who takes receipt of the goods must be subject to age verification. Where age verification is required, an original valid photographic identity document must be provided. Delivery staff shall be over 18 years of age. Where a delivery person has concerns further to child protection at any room to which alcohol has been delivered, these concerns shall be made known to the premises licence holder and duty manager with a minimum of delay, whereupon the premises licence holder shall report the matter to Wolverhampton's Emergency Duty Team.

An electronic or written refusals log will be maintained at the premises with a record of all refusals of admission or service, including the sale of alcohol. The refusals log will include the basis of a refusal; the person making the decision to refuse; the date and time of refusal. The refusals log will be kept for at least 12 months and will be produced to an officer of a responsible authority upon request.

Notes for Guidance

This application cannot be used to vary the licence so as to extend the period for which the licence has effect or to vary substantially the premises to which it relates. If you wish to make that type of change to the premises licence, you should make a new premises licence application under section 17 of the Licensing Act 2003.

1. You do not have to pay a fee if the only purpose of the variation for which you are applying is to avoid becoming liable for the late night levy

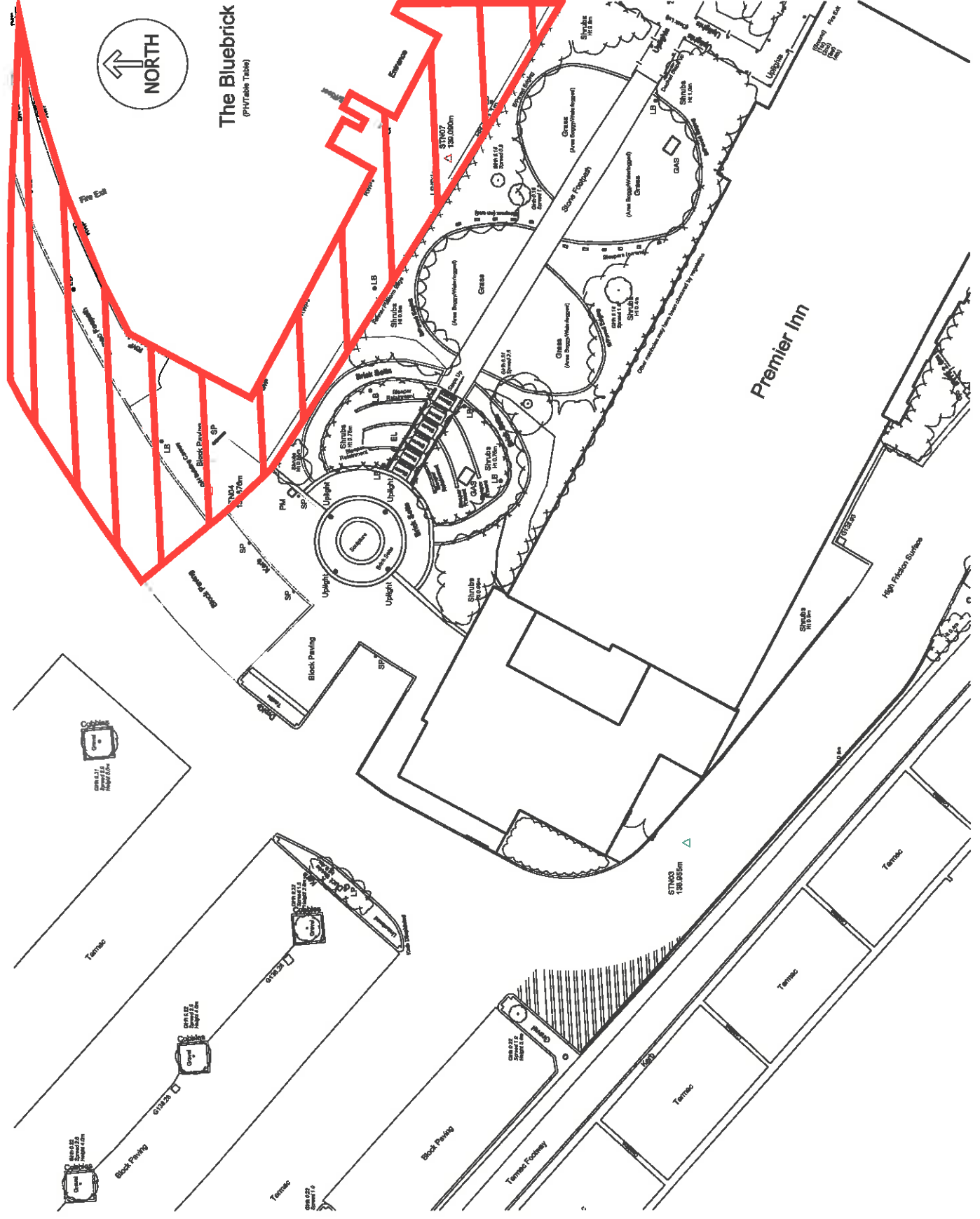
- Indoor sporting events: no licence is required for performances between 08.00 and 23.00 on any day, provided that the audience does not exceed 1000.
 - Boxing or Wrestling Entertainment: no licence is required for a contest, exhibition or display of Greco-Roman wrestling, or freestyle wrestling between 08.00 and 23.00 on any day, provided that the audience does not exceed 1000. Combined fighting sports – defined as a contest, exhibition or display which combines boxing or wrestling with one or more martial arts – are licensable as a boxing or wrestling entertainment rather than an indoor sporting event.
 - Live music: no licence permission is required for:
 - a performance of unamplified live music between 08.00 and 23.00 on any day, on any premises.
 - a performance of amplified live music between 08.00 and 23.00 on any day on premises authorised to sell alcohol for consumption on those premises, provided that the audience does not exceed 500.
 - a performance of amplified live music between 08.00 and 23.00 on any day, in a workplace that is not licensed to sell alcohol on those premises, provided that the audience does not exceed 500.
 - a performance of amplified live music between 08.00 and 23.00 on any day, in a church hall, village hall, community hall, or other similar community premises, that is not licensed by a premises licence to sell alcohol, provided that (a) the audience does not exceed 500, and (b) the organiser gets consent for the performance from a person who is responsible for the premises.
 - a performance of amplified live music between 08.00 and 23.00 on any day, at the non-residential premises of (i) a local authority, or (ii) a school, or (iii) a hospital, provided that (a) the audience does not exceed 500, and (b) the organiser gets consent for the performance on the relevant premises from: (i) the local authority concerned, or (ii) the school or (iii) the health care provider for the hospital.
 - Recorded Music: no licence permission is required for:
 - any playing of recorded music between 08.00 and 23.00 on any day on premises authorised to sell alcohol for consumption on those premises, provided that the audience does not exceed 500.
 - any playing of recorded music between 08.00 and 23.00 on any day, in a church hall, village hall, community hall, or other similar community premises, that is not licensed by a premises licence to sell alcohol, provided that (a) the audience does not exceed 500, and (b) the organiser gets consent for the performance from a person who is responsible for the premises.
 - any playing of recorded music between 08.00 and 23.00 on any day, at the non-residential premises of (i) a local authority, or (ii) a school, or (iii) a hospital, provided that (a) the audience does not exceed 500, and (b) the organiser gets consent for the performance on the relevant premises from: (i) the local authority concerned, or (ii) the school proprietor or (iii) the health care provider for the hospital.
 - Dance: no licence is required for performances between 08.00 and 23.00 on any day, provided that the audience does not exceed 500. However, a performance which amounts to adult entertainment remains licensable.
 - Cross activity exemptions: no licence is required between 08.00 and 23.00 on any day, with no limit on audience size for:
 - any entertainment taking place on the premises of the local authority where the entertainment is provided by or on behalf of the local authority;
 - any entertainment taking place on the hospital premises of the health care provider where the entertainment is provided by or on behalf of the health care provider;
 - any entertainment taking place on the premises of the school where the entertainment is provided by or on behalf of the school proprietor; and
 - any entertainment (excluding films and a boxing or wrestling entertainment) taking place at a travelling circus, provided that (a) it takes place within a moveable structure that accommodates the audience, and (b) that the travelling circus has not been located on the same site for more than 28 consecutive days.
