It is the responsibility of the Premises Licence Holder and the Designated Premises Supervisor to ensure that they are conversant and compliant with all current mandatory conditions in relation the Licensing Act 2003.

### **Conditions consistent with the Operating Schedule**

#### Historic Permissions consistent with the Justices Licence as converted under the Licensing Act 2003

#### **Provision of substantial refreshment**

Hot food or hot drinks may be provided in line with alcohol sales with an additional thirty minutes thereafter.

#### **Recorded Music**

• The playing of recorded music in the premises is permitted 24 hours a day pursuant to Section 182 of the Licensing Act 1964

#### **Private Entertainment**

• The provision of private entertainment for private gain is permitted 24 hours a day pursuant to Section 2 (2)(b) of the Private Places of Entertainment (Licensing Act) 1967.

#### Sale of Alcohol to residents

These premises are entitled to sell alcohol to residents and supply their bona fide guests 24 hours a day pursuant to section 63(2) LA 1964.

#### **New Years Eve**

The Regulatory Reform (Special Occasions Licensing) Order 2002.

• Where this licence does not otherwise permit, on New Years Eve these hours may be extended from the end of licensed hours on New Years Eve to the start of licensed hours on New Years Day.

#### General

I have undertaken my own risk assessment to take the following proposed steps.

- The types of regulated entertainment proposed materially do no more that reinstate the normal pub entertainment that was previously unregulated;
- No new steps have been identified in relation to the four licensing objectives save as below

#### Variation 10/09/2010

A risk assessment has been undertaken with regard to these changes to the licensed area. In view of the fact the licensable activities, nature of operation and overall format of the premises remain as previously granted, no new steps are to be offered.

#### Variation dated 2/12/16

The premises already has the benefit of external licensed area. Theses are sought to be enhanced but are already used in relation to the consumption of off sales. It is therefore not anticipated that any issues will arise indeed, the provision of waitress service into such areas will improve supervision and thereby promote the four licensing objectives.

### The prevention of crime and disorder

- Any person excercising a security activity (as defined by paragraph 2(1)(a) of schedule 2 of the Private Security Industry Act 2001) shall be licensed by the Security Industry Authority
- Such a person will be employed at the premises at the discretion of the designated premises supervisor/holder of the premises licence
- Any person as defined in condition (1) will clearly display his name badge at all times whilst on duty
- No customers apparently carrying open bottles upon entry shall be admitted to the premises at any times the premises are open to the public
- Where CCTV is installed with recording facilities such recordings shall be retained for a period of 30 days and made available within a reasonable time upon request by the police
- Alcoholic and other drinks may not be removed from the premises in open containers save for consumption in any external area provided for that purpose.

### **Public Safety**

No further risks have been identified which need to be addressed, save as below.

- To comply with the reasonable requirements of the Fire Officer from time to time
- To comply with the reasonable requirements of the Building Control Officer

### The prevention of public nuisance

No further risks have been identified which need to be addressed, save as below

- Where appropriate, prominent, clear and legible notices shall be displayed at all exits requesting the public respect the needs of local residents and to leave the premises and area quietly
- Noise or vibration shall not emanate from the premises so as to cause a nuisance to nearby properties

### The protection of children from harm

- The restrictions set out in the Licensing Act 2003 will apply.

  No unusual or additional risks of harm to children have been identified
- Children under the age of 16 shall not be permitted to enter the premises after 2200hrs

### Conditions attached after a hearing by the Licensing Authority

#### 14/09/2005

- The existing conditions attached to the Public Entertainment Licence dated 6 June 2005 shall apply to the Premises Licence for all the hours granted
- Signs shall be erected on the car park advising that private hire vehicles and hackney carriages should not sound their horms when collecting customers
- Signs shall be erected on the interior and exterior of the Premises asking patrons to leave the premises quietly.
- No Entertainment shall take place on the exterior part of the premises after 2100hrs (for the avoidance of doubt this condition shall include a prohibition on inflation and use of bouncy castles or similar)

- The Premises Licence Holder shall become a member of the Pub Watch Scheme
- The Premises Licence Holder shall ensure that automatic door closers are attached to the doors in the function room prior to 24th November 2005
- The Premises Licence Holder shall ensure regular exterior perimeter checks are made to ensure noise is not audible at the boundaries of the premises
- No music shall be played on the exterior part of the premises after 2100hrs and the exterior sound system shall be turned off
- At closing time the Premises Licence Holder shall ensure that the car park is cleared of patrons and secured within 30 minutes save this shall not prevent the access or egress of staff from the car park
- All windows and doors shall be kept closed during regulated entertainment.

#### 17/01/2007

- **1.** Signs shall be erected on the premises informing patrons when the barrier to the car park will be in operation and therefore when the car park will and will not be open for use.
- **2.** Noise or vibration shall not emanate from the licensed premises so as to cause nuisance to nearby premises after 2100 hours.
