The applicant is applying for a full premises licence variation to:

Premises licence number 21/22218/PRE was granted at the licensing hearing of 7 December 2021. The full premises licence has not yet been issued by Wolverhampton City Council following this approval, and consequently cannot be provided with this application.

Due to the premises' location within the Dudley Road Cumulative Impact Zone, the applicant is cognisant of the risks of adding to existing alcohol-related crime and disorder in the area.

- Approval of premises licence number 21/22218/PRE was subject to the licensing hearing of 7 December 2021. At the hearing, the Licensing Sub-Committee were satisfied that the applicant had rebutted the presumption of non-grant, applying to the Dudley Road Cumulative Impact Zone, both through its proposed operating schedule and the conditions set out in the Decision Notice dated 7 December 2021.

- Prior to 7 December 2021, the premises operated under the preceding, time-limited premises licence 19/18489/PRE (granted at hearing 23 September 2019) - the application for which was also deemed at hearing to have rebutted the presumption of non-grant.

- To reflect the increased risk of extended opening hours, and extended hours for off-licence sales of alcohol, additional and amended operating conditions are proposed as below. Rondel Trading Ltd has a history of problem-free alcohol sales at the premises since 23 September 2019 and is fully willing to work with the responsible authorities to address any additional concerns that this full variation application may pose.

b) The prevention of crime and disorder

Conditions 3 and 5 amended as per Section 15 of this form.

Proposed new condition:

Outside of the hours authorised for the sale of alcohol, whilst the premises are open to the public and whilst the night pay window is not in use, the licence holder shall ensure that all alcohol within the premises not displayed behind the counter is secured in a locked store room or behind locked grilles, locked screens or locked cabinet doors so as to prevent access to the alcohol by customers.

c) Public safety

- Indoor sporting events: no licence is required for performances between 08.00 and 23.00 on any day, provided that the audience does not exceed 1000.
- Boxing or Wrestling Entertainment: no licence is required for a contest, exhibition or display of Greco-Roman wrestling, or freestyle wrestling between 08.00 and 23.00 on any day, provided that the audience does not exceed 1000. Combined fighting sports – defined as a contest, exhibition or display which combines boxing or wrestling with one or more martial arts – are licensable as a boxing or wrestling entertainment rather than an indoor sporting event.
- Live music: no licence permission is required for:
 - o a performance of unamplified live music between 08.00 and 23.00 on any day, on any premises.
 - o a performance of amplified live music between 08.00 and 23.00 on any day on premises authorised to sell alcohol for consumption on those premises, provided that the audience does not exceed 500.
 - o a performance of amplified live music between 08.00 and 23.00 on any day, in a workplace that is not licensed to sell alcohol on those premises, provided that the audience does not exceed 500.
 - o a performance of amplified live music between 08.00 and 23.00 on any day, in a church hall, village hall, community hall, or other similar community premises, that is not licensed by a premises licence to sell alcohol, provided that (a) the audience does not exceed 500, and (b) the organiser gets consent for the performance from a person who is responsible for the premises.
 - o a performance of amplified live music between 08.00 and 23.00 on any day, at the non-residential premises of (i) a local authority, or (ii) a school, or (iii) a hospital, provided that (a) the audience does not exceed 500, and (b) the organiser gets consent for the performance on the relevant premises from: (i) the local authority concerned, or (ii) the school or (iii) the health care provider for the hospital.
- Recorded Music: no licence permission is required for:
 - o any playing of recorded music between 08.00 and 23.00 on any day on premises authorised to sell alcohol for consumption on those premises, provided that the audience does not exceed 500.
 - o any playing of recorded music between 08.00 and 23.00 on any day, in a church hall, village hall, community hall, or other similar community premises, that is not licensed by a premises licence to sell alcohol, provided that (a) the audience does not exceed 500, and (b) the organiser gets consent for the performance from a person who is responsible for the premises.
 - o any playing of recorded music between 08.00 and 23.00 on any day, at the non-residential premises of (i) a local authority, or (ii) a school, or (iii) a hospital, provided that (a) the audience does not exceed 500, and (b) the organiser gets consent for the performance on the relevant premises from: (i) the local authority concerned, or (ii) the school proprietor or (iii) the health care provider for the hospital.

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- Dance: no licence is required for performances between 08.00 and 23.00 on any day, provided that the audience does not exceed 500. However, a performance which amounts to adult entertainment remains licensable.
- Cross activity exemptions: no licence is required between 08.00 and 23.00 on any day, with no limit on audience size for:
 - o any entertainment taking place on the premises of the local authority where the entertainment is provided by or on behalf of the local authority;
 - o any entertainment taking place on the hospital premises of the health care provider where the entertainment is provided by or on behalf of the health care provider;
 - o any entertainment taking place on the premises of the school where the entertainment is provided by or on behalf of the school proprietor; and
 - o any entertainment (excluding films and a boxing or wrestling entertainment) taking place at a travelling circus, provided that (a) it takes place within a moveable structure that accommodates the audience, and (b) that the travelling circus has not been located on the same site for more than 28 consecutive days.
