Waiting Times

Outpatients (Average waiting time for first appointment)

- General Gynaecology 58 Weeks
- Urogynaecology- 54 Weeks
- Fertility 49 Weeks
- Menopause 43 Weeks
- Endometriosis 19 Weeks
- Paediatrics 29 Weeks

We are currently outsourcing some services to HealthHarmonie to support elective recovery.

Inpatients (Average waiting time to be seen based on clinical priority from the decision to add to the waiting list

Urgent – 6 Weeks

Soon – 20 Weeks

Routine – 25 Weeks



Choice and Access

Acute Services

- All acute services are at New Cross Hospital
- Gynaecology Assessment Unit (GAU) & Early Pregnancy Assessment Unit (EPAU).
 - Available Monday to Friday 8am 4pm
 - Out of Hours via Emergency Department
 - The service can be accessed by GPs who can directly contact via telephone and refer emergency patients via Nurse led triage.
 - Direct Access for patients (following telephone triage)
 - Emergency Service Support via Surgical Emergency Unit (out of hours)
 - Emergency Surgery



Choice and Access

Outpatient Services

- General Gynaecology
 - Suspected Cancer Referral
 - Nurse Led Triage within 3 days of referral
 - One Stop Clinics (Ultrasound Scan, Consultation and Hysteroscopy/ Biopsy)
- Urogynaecology
 - Urodynamics
 - Video Urodynamics
 - Pessary Clinics
- Endometriosis
 - Lifestyle Clinics



- Outpatient Services continued
 - Fertility
 - Menopause
 - Paediatrics
 - Gynaecology Oncology Level 3 Specialist Centre
 - Cancer Navigator supporting patients with Holistic needs.
 - Ambulatory
 - Hysteroscopy
 - Minor Procedure
 - Colposcopy (Screening Service & Treatment service)



Choice and Access

Outpatient Services continued:

- Advice and Guidance available for GPs to access.
- Services are provided at New Cross Hospital & some services at Cannock Hospital (site appropriate to pathways).
- Patient choice of female Doctor (For some sub specialities we are not able to offer this choice due to the workforce).

Inpatient Services – Based at New Cross Hospital

Patients are contacted via telephone at time of booking.



Initiatives in progress

- Endometriosis Centre Status Providing a service for patients diagnosed with complex endometriosis and able to provide Robotic surgery.
- Minor outpatient procedures
- Expanding Ambulatory Gynaecology
 - Expanded the service to offer a 5-day service for patient referred via the suspected cancer pathway.
 - Urogynaecology Exploring opportunities in setting up outpatient procedures
- Nurse Led Triage for suspected cancer patients
- Specialist Robotic surgery available for Oncology and Endometriosis
- Exploring options to expand the current GAU/EPAU Service from a 5 to 7-day service
- Same Day Discharge for selected Laparoscopic Hysterectomy surgical cases to improve patient experience and reduce length of stay for patient undergoing vaginal surgery.

Collaboration Communities

- Initiatives in progress continued
 - PIFU (Patient Initiated Follow Up)
 - Virtual Clinics.
 - Nurse Led Clinics for patients with acute minor problems.
 - Bereavement Nurse Led Clinics For patients & partners who have experienced early pregnancy loss
 - GIRFT Further Faster Initiatives to support with elective recovery
 - Expanding our multi professional teams
 - Future workforce and resources review being undertaken



Collaboration across the Black Country

- Working collaboratively across the Integrated Care Systems (ICS) with the aim of reducing health inequalities across the Black Country.
 - High Volume Low Complexity Pathways
 - Black Country Endometriosis Service
 - Workforce Review across the ICS
