**Application for a review of a Premises Licence under the Licensing Act 2003 -
Saver Express, 19 Finchfield Road West, Wolverhampton, WV3 8AY – PRE1127**

I write on behalf of the Licencing Authority, as a responsible authority, in support of the above review application made by Trading Standards. Representations are made in relation to the licensing objective of 'Prevention of Crime and Disorder and Protection of Children from Harm and the failure of the current management of the premises to promote and uphold these objectives.

On 1 December 2023, Trading Standards submitted an application to review the Premises Licence. The issues raised by Trading Standards relate to the underage sale of e-Cigarettes and alcohol taking place at the premises.

The Licensing Authority has concerns over the Premises Licence Holder Sonia Kaur and Designated Premises Supervisor, as the evidence provided by Trading Standards within their application indicates that the premises are not adhering to their legal obligations and are not upholding the licensing objectives 'of Prevention of Crime and Disorder, Protection of Children from Harm.

The evidence shows a disregard for public safety and the law by the Premises Licence Holder, and Designated Premises Supervisor.

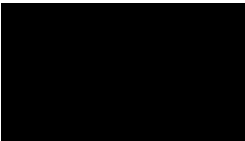
If Councillors are satisfied that illegal activities have taken place at the premises, in breach of upholding the licensing objectives, the Licensing Authority requests that the Statutory Licensing Sub-Committee ensure these issues are addressed in accordance with Section 52 of the Licensing Act 2003 and guidance issued by the Secretary of State under 182 of the Act, together with City of Wolverhampton Council's Statement of Licensing Policy.

Councillors may conclude from the evidence given within the review application and at the hearing in order to promote the licensing objectives of Crime and Disorder and Public Safety that modification of the premises licence or suspension of the licence to ensure the current

management of the premises fully understands their roles and responsibilities is not a suitable option and that there is no alternative but to revoke the licence.

The Licensing Authority fully supports the review application brought by Trading Standards and concludes the above issues must be resolved in order to promote the licensing objectives of Prevention of Crime and Disorder, Prevention of Public Nuisance, Protection of Children from Harm and Public Safety. I shall be in attendance at the hearing, should Councillors have any questions or require any further assistance.
