Application for a Review of a Premises Licence under Licensing Act 2003 Cameron Covenience, 575 Parkfield Road, Wolverhampton WV4 6EL

I write on behalf of the Licensing Authority as a responsible authority. I write in support of the above review application made by Trading Standards Service. Representations are made against the protection of children from harm licensing objective the failure of the current management of the premises to promote this licensing objective.

The premises licence holder, Angelo Salvo and the management of the premises have not demonstrated they are operating in accordance with their premises licence and therefore are not promoting the licensing objective of the protection of children from harm.

The issues raised by Trading Standards relate to the selling of alcohol to persons under the age of 18. This shows a blatant disregard to the licensing objective by the premises licence holder and the management of the premises.

If Councillors are satisfied that illegal activities have taken place at the premises and are in breach of promoting the licensing objectives, the Licensing Authority would request the Licensing Sub-Committee ensure these issues are addressed by considering modification of the current premises licence in accordance with Section 52 of The Licensing Act 2003 and guidance issued by the Secretary of State under 182 of the Act together with Wolverhampton City Council's Statement of Licensing Policy.

Councillors may conclude from the evidence given within the review application and at the hearing in order to promote the licensing objectives it is necessary to add the due diligence conditions requested by Trading Standards Service, remove the designated premises supervisor or suspend the licence to ensure the current management of the premises fully understand their roles and responsibilities regarding the sale of alcohol.

The Licensing Authority fully supports the review application brought by Trading Standards Service and concludes the above issues should be resolved in order to promote the licensing objective of the protection of children from harm.
