

Delegations to the Director of Adult Services

I	Function	Limits or restrictions on delegation
11	To act as the statutory Director of Adult Services.	
12	The provision of improvements and adaptations under the Chronically Sick and Disabled Persons Act 1970 within the Council's agreed scheme of financial delegations in respect of each application.	
13	In consultation with the Director of Governance to authorise the institution of appropriate legal proceedings, including in the Court of Protection, in respect of adults.	
14	To make arrangements for the temporary protection of property of persons admitted to hospital or other accommodation.	
15	To make application to act, and to act as receiver of property for persons who are incapable of managing their own affairs.	
16	To make arrangements for the burial or cremation of any person found dead in their area where no suitable arrangements have been made under Part III of Public Health (Control of Disease) Act 1984.	
17	To exercise the statutory functions, powers and duties of the Council in relation to vulnerable adults and adults

To discharge the functions conferred on or exercisable by the council in its capacity as Adult Social Services Authority conferred by the Local Authority Social Services Act 1970, the Care Act 2014 and all other health and social care legislation for adults including in relation to mental health.

- 18 To make applications for the admission to hospital of persons with mental health problems for the purposes of assessment, detention and treatment and to make decisions in connection with deprivation of liberty safeguards.

- 19 To maintain the appropriate registration for internally provided care services.

- 110 To appoint approved mental health professionals.

- 111 To discharge any functions exercisable by the council under Section 75 of the National Health Service Act 2006 on behalf of an NHS body and have the responsibility for any adults functions integrated with any NHS body.

- 112 To be designated as the 'responsible person' required by the Local Authority Social Services and National Health Service Complaints (England) Regulations 2009 to ensure compliance with the procedures and ensure action is taken in the light of complaints and also for other statutory complaints procedures relating to adults complaints.
