It's a good gesture they wish to reduce the event from two day's to one day but I still believe Bantock Park is not the right venue for this event due to the highly residential nature of the area.

I have read all the information and points which they have addressed but still feel after last year when we were reassured the event would be monitored on the day it was nothing like they promised,

I do not feel reassured this event will be any different, if the event goes ahead on the day we will still have to endure 10 hours of noise pollution and stress plus testing the day before.

Will the EHO just be based at the park or will they be out and about in the surrounding areas to monitor the noise. Whilst I'm aware the council need to raise fund's I feel the needs and concerns of residents in the highly populated area are being ignored in favour of revenue and the haven of our home's being compromised, last year the music could be heard in Tettenhall wood, Codsall and Perton, surely that in it's self say a lot

Also what was not taken in to account last event was the amount of people sat outside the venue zone in the park drinking alcohol with no restrictions or monitoring, and can imagine this year it being more with word of mouth and Facebook advertising that point
